

JUDITH DIANNE JACKSON SCHOLARSHIP FUND 2018

The Judith Jackson Scholarship Fund was created to honor the life and legacy of a true champion of youth. Judith Jackson dedicated her life to improving the lives and opportunities for young men and women who have completed their high school education. She dedicated her life to removing barriers for young people and helping them realize their greatness to pursue their dreams and impact their communities.

This scholarship is administered by Neighborhood Service Organization (NSO) in honor of Judith Dianne Jackson who was a close community partner and friend.

Judith Dianne Jackson, affectionately known as Judy, was born July 1, 1950 to Clayton R. and Amy Pettiford Jackson in Marion, Indiana. She was the youngest of three children who grew up in a loving, nurturing environment.

After graduating from Marion High School with honors in 1968, Judy earned a Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from Indiana University in 1972. She earned her Master's Degree in Social Work in 1974 from Washington University in St. Louis.

Before coming to Detroit in 1980 to join Family and Neighborhood Services, Judy served in assignments at St. Louis and New York. In Detroit, she met Dr. Gerald K. Smith who became a mentor and friend. In 1982, she joined Gerald as Deputy Director of Franklin-Wright Settlements. Judy became the Executive Director in 1990. In 1999, Gerald recruited Judy to serve as Vice President and Chief Operation Officer for a new youth program. The program opened as Youthville Detroit which provided unprecedented recreational and educational opportunities for Detroit youth. In 2008, she became President and Chief Executive Officer until its closing in 2014.

Judy's roles in civic organizations include stints as President of the National Association of Black Social Workers, President of the Detroit Association of Black Social Workers. She served on the Boards of Plymouth Education Center Charter School, New Detroit and ARISE.

On the morning of October 9, 2015, Judy went to sleep peacefully in the arms of the Lord.

APPLICATION INFORMATION & DIRECTIONS

THE SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The Judith Dianne Jackson Scholarship Fund (the "Scholarship") will provide \$1,000 annually toward tuition and/or related educational expenses (such as room, board, books) of an undergraduate program at a regionally accredited four-year-degree-granting college, university, a two-year community, junior college or skills trade school. The option of attending a two-year community or junior college must be part of an educational plan to continue a student's education at an accredited two or four-year college, university or training program. The scholarship is not limited to colleges or universities located in the state of Michigan. The scholarship awards will be issued by The Judith Dianne Jackson Scholarship Fund directly to the school or scholarship winners as appropriate.

The scholarship is renewable up to three times for a total of \$4,000 over four years of undergraduate study as long as the recipient maintains a GPA of 2.5 for the preceding scholastic year. If in the opinion of the Scholarship Committee, unusual and unexpected circumstances result in a scholarship recipient not reaching the 2.5 GPA, that requirement may be suspended following discussion with the Scholarship Committee and the scholarship recipient.

To be eligible for the renewal, it is expected that the scholarship recipients will file a report with The Judith Dianne Jackson Scholarship Fund at the end of each academic year (but no later than June 15) summarizing the scholarship recipient's college experience and to verify by submission of official transcripts that the recipient has met the criteria for continuation of the scholarship. At this point, the student must express intent to continue his/her college education for another year.

ELIGIBILITY AND PREFERENCES

In order to be eligible for The Judith Dianne Jackson Scholarship, candidates must meet the following requirements:

- Applicants must be in their senior year of high school planning to graduate by spring of 2018.
- These scholarships will be awarded to the most deserving youth, following the guidelines described above, and based upon the selection criteria set forth below in the "SELECTION OF WINNERS" section.
- 3. Applicant must be enrolled to begin study by fall of 2018 (proof of enrollment required).
- 4. Applicant must have a 2.5 GPA.
- 5. Applicant must be a high school senior.

The application deadline is March 2, 2018. The application and supplementary attachments MUST BE RECEIVED by this date in order to meet the deadline. Only completed application packets will be considered for scholarship awards.

Please note the last section of the application is an **Application Checklist** provided to help you ensure your application has been completed correctly. Please note as well that presentation, sentence and paragraph structure, spelling and grammar do count, so be sure to proofread your entire application.

SELECTION OF WINNERS

The Scholarship Selection Committee will select winners based on an evaluation of the complete application and the personal interviews with the finalists. The Committee will strongly consider academic achievements and credentials, such as the applicant's high school class rank, transcripts, GPA, curriculum and ACT or SAT scores. The Committee will also consider evidence of leadership qualities, extracurricular activities, community service, work experience outside of school, honors and awards, and recognition by his/her peers. The Committee will also evaluate the applicant's personal qualities, motivation and interests as demonstrated in the letters of recommendation and the personal essay.

All applicants will be notified of their status as either a finalist or no longer under consideration on or before **March 15, 2018**. Interviews with the finalists will be completed no later than **March 22, 2018** and will be conducted in person. The interviews, which are informal, will last approximately 30 minutes and are being conducted so the Scholarship Committee will have an opportunity to meet personally and get to know the applicant, and the applicant will get to know the Scholarship Committee members. The applicants will also be able to ask questions of the Scholarship Committee and make a final statement to the Scholarship Committee at the end of the interview. Please be prepared to share Judith Dianne Jackson's contributions to Detroit Youth during her life. Her complete bio can be found on the website – www.jdjscholarship.org.

The Scholarship Committee, will make the final determination regarding winners and will notify all finalists, by telephone or email, as to its final decisions on or before **March 26, 2018**.

All letters of recommendation must be signed.
