Stewardship Reflection

"..they fell down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh..." - Matthew 2:11

EPIPHANY

What do we seek?

Whether we intend it or not, we are all on a journey through this world of ours. Some of these journeys won't take us beyond the confines of our routines, but others lead beyond our wildest dreams. If we turn our faces toward the Holy One, we will become a holy people, and shine like the stars for eternity. Nothing we gain on this route can ever be lost.


