

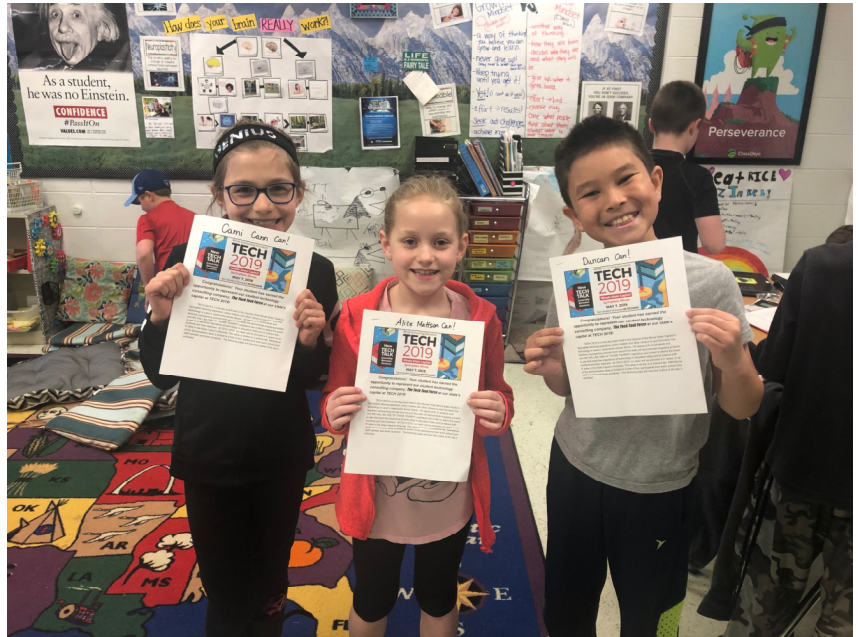
Yorkville CUSD 115 students to present at state capitol
