18th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) Sunday 4 August 2024 "Looking Beyond"

We begin with a story.

There were three brick layers working very hard on a construction site. When asked "What are you doing?" the first brick layer stated that he was simply laying one brick on another brick; the second brick layer said that he was proudly building a great wall; the third bricklayer stood back from what he was doing and looked around and said with great love that he was building a Cathedral! This story gets us thinking about the different ways people may see their meaning or purpose in life.

The Scripture readings of this Sunday offer us a deeper meaning of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish recalled last week. This miracle worked by Jesus also recollects the manna raining down from the heavens to provide food for the Israelites during their long journey through the wilderness. According to Moses the manna was given to them by God – not just to satisfy their immediate physical hunger but to be a sign that God would be with his people in all their trials. Today St Paul in his message to the people in Ephesus urges them to reflect on the deeper meaning of their relationship with Jesus urging them to put aside their old ways of living and be transformed by a change of heart into living by God's ways. Jesus' message in the gospel today is very similar.

John's gospel is a deeper reflection of the depth of the Eucharist in our lives. It describes what takes place after the crowds ate the multiplied bread Jesus had fed them to relieve their physical hunger. Jesus reminds them they must look beyond immediate physical discomforts and struggles and put their efforts into deepening their relationship with their God. When Jesus calls Himself the 'Living Bread' sent from heaven and parallels it to God raining manna upon His people wandering in the desert, His message to them is that He, through His life, teaching, healing and selfless giving is the presence of the Love of God in their world now: He is the living food that enriches – that channels the Father's love and peace to empower and reconnect each person with their God within and beyond the trials, losses and struggles that life brings.

Jesus challenged those who sought Him out to go beyond seeing Him as a miracle worker who could satisfy their immediate physical needs. He was challenging them look beyond the bread that they received to satisfy their temporal hunger condition to see their lives, their neighbours and world through eyes and hearts of

faith. He challenges us in the same way.

As we gather to share the Eucharist today, may we who gather as one body to give thanks for God's constant love made present to us through Jesus' giving of His life, look beyond the bread that we share to become bread for othersbringing hope to those in despair, consolation and friendship to the lonely and justice and peace to those fleeing from unsafe and unfriendly environments. May God be proclaimed through our living!

Thursday 8 August - St Mary of the Cross (MacKillop)

Thursday August 8 is the Solemnity of Australia's first

Saint, St Mary of the Cross MacKillop. Sr Mary of the Cross co-founded the Sisters of St Joseph with Fr Julian Tenison Woods in the small town of Penola within our Archdiocese of Adelaide. Life was marked by poverty in those early years, and for a time she was excommunicated by the Bishop of Adelaide.

Gaining approval for her Order from Rome, her works in education, especially among poor children in remote towns, flourished. To that she added care of the aged, visitation of the poor and of prisoners, along with shelter for pregnant teenagers.

Her Scottish heritage blended with the harshness of life in 19th century Australia and gave her a faith which weathered all storms, always with great trust in the Providence of God. The last several years of her life were spent in a wheelchair following a stroke. She died in 1909 and was canonised in 2010 by Pope Benedict.

As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!'

GOSPEL

John 6:24-35

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?'

Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat.

Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life, the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you, for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.'

Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign

will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread; for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered:

'I am the bread of life.

THE NICENE CREED.
