

FROM THE VICAR

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Like Christmas, Easter isn't just a one-day event in the Church. Rather, the season of Easter lasts for fifty days, ending on the Day of Pentecost. Also like Christmas, once the day is past, the joy and excitement seem to fade. We've had the sunrise service, heard the wonderful musicians, sang all the great hymns... Now what?

I imagine this feeling is what Peter and the other apostles felt after the resurrection, in John 21. Jesus has risen from the dead and miraculously appeared to them twice so far...but He hasn't stayed there with them. And so the apostles have gone back home to Galilee from Jerusalem. Not knowing what else to do, Peter says, "I'm going fishing," and the rest come along. They're all out on the Sea of Galilee, where several of them were when Jesus first called them. They've had the joy and excitement, the sadness and pain, of the last three years following Jesus, and now they're seemingly right back where they started.

But then someone gives some questionable fishing advice from the shore, and one miraculous catch of fish later, everything is different. John is yelling, "It is the Lord!" even though he can't clearly see Him. Peter is jumping overboard, clothes and all, not waiting for Jesus to call him. And once all 153 fish are drug ashore, the disciples are once again fed and cared for by Jesus.

We can often find ourselves "back where we started" as well. After leaving Easter service, or any Sunday, we might be on a high note. But then as the week drags on, and the problems and worries of the world weigh us down, we can begin to feel lost and worn down. However, just as Christ appeared to the disciples again, so He comes to feed and comfort us every Sunday. In His Word, we hear again His promises of hope and comfort. In His Supper, Jesus is physically with us, feeding our souls and strengthening our faith. His presence gives us endurance to follow Him, just like it did for His disciples. Jesus has promised His Church, promised us, that He will never leave us nor forsake us. And every Sunday, He fulfills His promise. Thanks be to God!
