

I have often thought it would be helpful for followers of Jesus to be voracious readers who absorb information, receive encouragement, and are mentored by gifted writers. I have also often thought that every Christian should have a basic home library to draw from. Here are some of the books that I would recommend for such a library of resources:

NIV Study Bible • a very good and readable translation with excellent study notes throughout.

Mere Christianity by C. S. Lewis • A thoughtful presentation of basic Christianity.

Hailey's Bible Handbook • A great introduction to the Bible (there are other equally helpful Bible handbooks including The Bible for Dummies).

The New Bible Dictionary (InterVarsity Press) • An excellent resource that defines most terms found in scripture.

The New Bible Commentary (also InterVarsity Press) • A wonderful commentary on the entire Bible in one volume (it's a rather big volume).

Introducing the Reformed Faith by Donald K. McKim • This book gets you into theology but in a fairly approachable way.

What's So Amazing About Grace? by Phillip Yancey • "Grace" is the foundational reality Jesus brought into the world. This is an amazing book.

The Jesus I Never Knew by Phillip Yancey • There are many books about the person of Jesus. This one is very easy to follow and is very helpful in dispelling false understandings about Jesus.

New Signage and New Adventures Coming

he past month has been a time of focusing on two significant projects – enhancing the signage on our campus and a "mission trip" opportunity to shine the light of Christ to our neighbors in El Cajon.

New Signage

To make it easier for people to find Trinity Church, I am working with the Building and Grounds team to update the sign at Campo Road and Kenwood Drive. We are also working to replace the sign at the entry to the church campus and add lettering to identify Williams Hall. Our hope is to complete these projects by the end of August.

"Building Bridges with Our Muslim Neighbors"

"Building Bridges with Our Muslim Neighbors" is the name being given to our "staycation with a purpose" planned for September 24th through October 7th. This unique two-week immersion into local Muslim communities and cultures gives us the opportunity to learn about our neighbors, be equipped to build relationships with them, and share the love of Jesus in culturally meaningful ways.

In order to prepare for this mission trip, I have been attending a few

seminars focused on reaching out to Muslim refugees. Here is what I have learned:

First, the San Diego area has been receiving upwards of 100 families a week – families that have lived through some of the most traumatic experiences imaginable.

Secondly, these refugees have had their homes or neighborhoods bombed, family members or friends shot in front of them, or worse.

They ran away to poorly staffed refugee camps, where they lacked food, water, and adequate housing, all the while trying to get into another

Partnering with Lifewater International -

To provide fresh water, sanitary toilet facilities, hygiene training, and the message of God's love in Jesus Christ

ur recent mid-week Bible
Study focused on "The Hole
in Our Gospel" that called us
to see that the "good news" of God's
love in Jesus must be conveyed in
words and in acts that meet human
needs. Among the greatest need in
the world today is fresh water. Over
half the people of the world do not
have ready access to clean, safe
drinking water.

For 41 years, Lifewater has worked in 45 countries, and has served more than 2.5 million people. Lifewater serves vulnerable communities by providing clean water, sanitation, and hygiene. This group also partners with local churches and ministries to share the Gospel in each village that is served.

The Opportunity Before Us

Partnering with Lifewater (www. lifewater.org) gives Trinity Church the opportunity to provide clean water to a rural village or villages in Uganda or Ethiopia (the actual site is still to be determined). This is the most cost-effective way to eliminate poverty and to improve health. By sponsoring a village water project, we will provide sanitation and hygiene training as well as a water asset for an entire village.

- \$6,000 serves a small village of about 150 people
- \$12,000 serves a medium sized village of about 250 people
- \$18,000 serves a large village of about 400 people

A Generous Offer

A family in our church has graciously committed to match the funds we raise up to \$12,000! This means if we raise \$12,000, we will really have \$24,000 – enough to serve a village of over 600 people.

Please consider how you can help. A Dedicated Account is set-up to receive funds. Make checks payable to Trinity Church (write "Lifewater" on the memo line).

Once we raise the funds we will learn of the village or villages we and Lifewater will serve. We will get to know the people and follow the progress of the projects. We will help convey the whole gospel.

country. Then, if they were accepted to a country like the U.S., they faced a completely foreign culture, language, and social structure. They have lived through three incredibly traumatic events.

Thirdly, I learned the main outreach to these refugee families is spearheaded by Christians living in North County. They are driving more than 30 miles one way, as often as once a week, to visit, help, and encourage refugee families they have befriended. I am amazed at the dedication these brothers and sisters in Christ have to serve people that live in *our* backyard. They haven't just thrown money at them. Instead, they have taken time

to be a part of the lives of the families they have befriended.

Fourthly, despite the work of many North San Diego County Christians, there are many families to whom we can minister. We have the opportunity to be Jesus to a group of people who probably would never have seen or heard the Gospel in their home country. God has put people He loves in our hands to love in ways they will understand. We are responsible as Jesus followers to bring them to the feet of Jesus.

Some have expressed fear regarding what we want to do with refugees.

Jesus constantly encouraged,

exhorted, and commanded His followers to never fear. Wisdom cannot involve fear; it involves learning and understanding with lots of love and grace.

In the near future, we will be providing more details for this new venture!
