# PASTOR'S POST

A few weeks back I recounted in a sermon about an exchange I had with a person on church property that was without a place to sleep for the night. In fact, the person had been out on the street for several nights and needed a bed. As I said at the time, there aren't many solutions for homelessness in the West Valley and sometimes the solutions we have available aren't ones that the person in need is ready to embrace.

My sharing about this encounter led to a number of conversations and it has given me much to think about, primarily how fortunate I am to have the blessings I have in my life, many of which I take for granted.

Now in Advent, with Christmas coming, in the hustle and bustle of gift giving and receiving, amid the joys and the challenges of the holiday season, here's a reminder for us to reflect upon which I find gets at the heart of thankfulness. The words come from a poster that lies on my desk, published by <a href="https://www.livelifehappy.com">www.livelifehappy.com</a>:

If you have food in your fridge, clothes on your back, a roof over your head, and a place to sleep, you are richer than 75% of the world. If you have money in the bank, your wallet, and some spare change, you are among the top 8% of the worlds wealthy. If you woke up this morning with more health than illness, you are more blessed than the million people who will not survive this week. If you have never experienced the danger of battle, the agony of imprisonment or torture, or the horrible pangs of starvation, you are luckier than 500 million people alive and suffering. If you can read this message you are more fortunate than 3 billion people in the world who cannot read it at all – Author Unknown.

I have so much to be thankful for this holiday season and every day of the year. You have so much to be thankful for this holiday season and every day of the year. I encourage us to give even more thanks for the all blessings God provides. And as we take stock of our God given abundance, perhaps we will find new ways to make resources available for others. 

### From Your Parish Nurse, Lisa Dunbar.....

Greetings from your Parish Nurse!

This month, the "E" in RESILIENCE is "Expressing Love, Appreciation and Gratitude". Why is this important to our being able to bounce back and recover from the difficulties we face? Because expressing love, appreciation and gratitude are expressions of relationship. More than any other aspect of our health and strength, most of us find that when "the chips are down", it is relationships that carry us through. Maybe it is a friend that listens when things are tough, maybe it is a spouse that sacrifices what they would normally do to meet your needs, maybe it is a quick call from someone who cares, but all of these relationships help us to persevere.

So how do we begin to build and maintain positive relationships? Initially by reaching out and thinking of someone else rather than ourselves. My Mom once gave me advice when I was just a teenager and about to go on a weekend retreat where I knew no one. She said ,"Look for someone else who looks shy or lonely and help them to have a good time." I hated at the time to admit she was absolutely right. It worked! And it still works today. We have many "unconnected" people in our church right now both visitors and snowbirds. What would it take to reach out, introduce yourself and maybe even invite them out for lunch to get to know them? We all need to cultivate new relationships.

But what about relationships we already have? How do we build and maintain them? Positive communication is a must in any relationship. How often do we say to our spouse, our children, our friends "I love you. Thank you for ...". I hate to admit that I am not the best at this! It is harder at times to remember to appreciate someone than to take them for granted or criticize something they have done.

Recently, our study group on Wednesdays (All are Welcome) began studying "Choosing Gratitude" by Nancy DeMoss. One point that she makes is that Gratitude needs to become a lifestyle – not a one- time thing. We need to consciously work to develop gratitude to God and others in our lives. If we do so, we become more positive in our outlook and find more joy in our day to day lives.

How about starting today by making a list of 10 things for which you are grateful. Is there something on the list that you want to share with another? For instance, writing or saying to one of your children, "Thank you for checking in with me from time to time. I really appreciate knowing what is happening in your life." Or to a spouse, "Thank you for doing that for me. It really helps me and I appreciate it."

Remember that positive relationships make a difference in our ability to face the challenges of our lives, so reach out with a positive communication today!
