RULES: The regatta will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2017-2020 (RRS) as changed by RRS Appendix E, this Notice of Race NoR, the sailing instructions (SI), and the Equipment Rules of Sailing. The Sailing Instructions shall prevail in case of conflict with this NoR.

ELIGIBILITY: The competition is open to all DragonFlite 95 Restricted Class Boats that comply with the most current Restricted Class Rules listed at <https://dfracing.world/df95-rules/>. All entrants must be current AMYA member or their national authority.

REGISTRATION AND EVENT INSPECTION: Boats shall be presented for registration between 08:00 and 10:00 October 24, 2019 at the sailing site for event inspection. However, the race committeeman extend the time for registration and event inspections if there is a valid reason to do so. NO BOAT SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR RACING UNTIL IT HAS BEEN REGISTERED AND INSPECTED FOR THE EVENT.

NOTE, REGISTRATIONS ARE LIMITED TO 50, WHICH WILL ACCOMMODATE 3 FLEETS.

SCORING and RACING SYSTEM: Scoring will be carried out in accordance with HMS 2017 as modified by the sailing instructions.

PRE-REGISTRATION and FEES: Online registration will start on 4/8/2019. Registration can be completed thru the AMYA Regatta Site. Fees are payable thru Paypal online, on or before 10/1/19. No refunds will be given after that date.

Entrants Will Be Limited To The First 50 Registrations.

Entry fee is \$75 per boat and includes, beverages, snacks, lunch 10/25-27/19. Guest fee is \$10/day.

FREQUENCIES: Permitted frequency bands are FCC-approved surface bands. Transmitters on 75 MHz must be narrow band certified. Radio frequencies will be allocated on "first come first served" basis. No exceptions. 2.4 GHz radios are permitted and are exempt from rule E1.5 in the RSS.

FOOD SERVICE: Lunch and snacks will be catered for Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Snacks & drinks will be provided throughout the 3 days. Lunch breaks will be determined by the race staff on site and shall be administered, as needed by the PRO. Guest lunch fee is \$10/person per day payable in advance or at pre registration at the pond.

AWARDS: Awards will be for placements 1-5 of final results.

LIABILITY: All those entering or taking part in this regatta do so at their own risk and responsibility. Charleston Model Yacht Club, Charleston County Parks, or any other parties involved in the organization of this event disclaim any and all responsibility whatsoever for loss, damage, injury, or inconvenience that might occur to persons and goods, both ashore and on the water as a consequence of entering or participating in the event covered by this Notice of Race. At all times the responsibility for the safety of their boat and themselves including the decision to participate or continue shall rest with the competitors. By entering this event, it is deemed that you accept these conditions. Competitors and participants are advised to ensure that they have adequate insurance that provides coverage for public liability and they're possible injury in the country and county of this event.

ENTRY DEADLINE: Entries must be made online no later than October 1, 2019. Late entries may be accepted onsite October 25, 2019; however, these entries will not be eligible for any apparel, or customer giveaways. Late entries will be only at the discretion of the regatta chairman. No refunds after October 1, 2019.

ACCOMMODATIONS: The regatta is located at the James Island County.

Sailing Instructions

1. RULES

1.1* The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), Appendix E for RC Sailing, the prescriptions of US Sailing, the Class Rules of DR-95 Class and these Sailing Instructions.

1.2 Changes to the Racing Rules or Class Rules are noted in the specific instructions where they apply.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS: Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board located at the scorekeeping admin table at the pond at James County Park during the regatta.

3. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS: Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 9AM, on the day before it will take effect. OR Verbal changes to these instructions may be made anytime. All competitors will be notified by the PRO.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

4.1* Dates of racing: Friday 10/25 8:30-12noon Chk-in, Inspections/Lunch, 1300-1700, Seed Races
Saturday 10/26 Skippers meeting at 9am 9:00-12noon Racing; 12-1300 Lunch; 13:00-17:00. Racing.
Sunday 10/27 9:00-12noon Racing; 12:00- Lunch, Final Results and Awards.

4.2* The total number of races planned is 16 depending on wind. The race committee will determine the number of races for each day after considering, weather, course & equipment conditions. No race shall start after 17:00.

4.3* The scheduled time of the Preparatory signal for the first (Heat or Races) each day is 8:50.

4.4* When there has been a postponement lasting over 3 minutes, the warning signal for the first race following the postponement and each succeeding race will be made as soon as practical, at the POR's discretion. An audible signal will be sounded at least 1 minutes before the Warning Signal for the first race following the postponement.

5. RACING FORMAT

5.1 The racing format will be HMS

5.3 Please take your boat out of the water as soon as possible after finishing.

6. THE COURSE BOARD: Course board, if used is to be located as required by Rule Appendix E

7. THE START

7.1 The AMYA one minute starting sequence will be used. The Preparatory signal is defined as when the auditory sequence begins; the "Warning" signal is defined as when the countdown begins. This changes rule E3.5.2.

7.2 Boats whose Warning Signal has not sounded shall stay clear of the starting area.

7.3 A boat starting later than 1/2 minute after her starting signal will be scored DNS. This changes rule A4.7.

14. 7.4 OCS (on course side) If any part of a boat's hull or equipment is on the course side of the starting line after the preparatory signal, the line judge or PRO will attempt to hail that boat. Failure of the line judge to make a hail or a skipper to hear such a hail will be grounds for PROTEST, or request for a redress hearing. This changes Rule 62.1(a).

8. HOLDS

15. 8.1 Holds will be announced periodically by the POR at his discretion, for restroom and other breaks such as changes in weather conditions, and for scheduled lunch breaks. Holds may not be requested by competitors.
16. 8.2 Changes to boats during holds, competitors may not make tuning or other adjustments during hold periods.

9. TIME LIMITS

17. 9.1 If no boat has passed Mark 1, within 10 minutes, the race will be abandoned.
18. 9.2 If no boat has finished within 20 minutes, the race will be abandoned.
- 9.3 Boats failing to finish within 5 minutes after the first finishes, will be scored DNF. This changes Rules 35 & A4.
- 9.4 The POR's watch is official for purposes of signals and time limits.

10. THE FINISH: THE FINISHING LINE WILL BE BETWEEN THE FINISHING MARKS

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 11.1 OCS- A boat with any part of her hull or equipment on the course side of the starting line, or its extensions after the Warning Signal shall return to the pre-start side as required by Rule 30.1 and modified by Rule E3.6.
- 11.2 A boat touching a marks defined by Rule 31.1 shall take penalty turn as required by Rule 31.2.
- 11.3 A boat breaking a Rule in RRS Part 2, shall take a one-turn (360) alternate penalty as required by Rule 44 and modified by E4.4.
- 11.4 As provided in Rule 67, the Protest Committee may, without a hearing, penalize a boat that has broken Rule 42.

12. PROTESTS

- 12.1 A boat protesting another boat, while sailing, shall hail the other boat, as required by Rule 61.1(a) as modified by Rule E5.2.
- 12.2 Boats filing a protest with the protest committee shall do so thither 5 minutes of when the last boat finishes the Heat in which the incident occurred and shall also inform the race committee (PRO) within 5 minutes of the finish of the relevant Heat as required by Rule 61.3 as modified by E5.3. The protest is to be written. Skippers will be granted additional time to file a protest, if required in order to record relevant facts at the PRO's sole discretion.
- 12.3 Protests will be heard immediately following the heat in which the incident occurred and before the next heat.
- 12.4 As provided by RRS Rule 70.4 in a regatta being sailed under HMS, there shall be no appeals on decisions made by the protest committee. If redress is required, it will consist of the average of the previous 4 races, or the races completed that day whichever is less.

13. SCORING

- 13.1 The Low Point System described in RRS Appendix A shall be used.
- 13.2 Fifteen races will be required to be completed to constitute the regatta.

14. EQUIPMENT CHECKS

14.1 A boat and her equipment may be inspected at anytime for compliance with Class Rules and sailing instructions.

14.2 If any equipment is found to have been modified, skipper involved will be scored DNS for all races to the point when the modifications were discovered in the regatta.

15 AWARDS Awards will be given as follows: Awards will be earned for the top 5 skippers for the 3 days sailing placements.

16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY: Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

17. SPORTSMANSHIP AND CORINTHIAN SPIRIT; Remember we are always in Friendly competition.

17.1 In the event of any protested behavior which is deemed to be breach of good manners or sportsmanship, or which may bring the sport into disrepute, the PRO, any designated race official, or competitor may protest the party or parties in accordance with RRS #2.

17.2 Penalties available to the PRO and/or protest committee, include exclusion from the race in question or expulsion from the regatta as per RRS #69.2 and #69.3.

17.3 In the event a skipper is penalized under RRS #2 at an AMYA event, a report of the incident shall be sent to the AMYA Class Secretary of the class being sailed and the AMYA executive board for review.
