Greetings Everyone!

As we turn to March, we come to the season of Lent. Lent, of course, is the 40 days of preparation for Easter Sunday, where we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead! This year, the season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd.

The reason for Lent is commonly related to suffering and sacrifice, which Jesus endured on the cross. We use 40 days to coincide with the 40 days of Jesus in the wilderness, where he fasted

and faced the Devil's temptations.

Matthew 4:1-2 • Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. After fasting for forty days and forty nights, he was hungry.



Mark 1:12-13 • At once the Spirit sent him out into the wilderness, and he was in the wilderness forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and angels attended him.

Luke 4:1-2 • Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led

> by the Spirit into the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry.

Like Jesus in the wilderness, we

face suffering, where our bodies, minds, and spirits become weak. In those weaknesses, the temptations to abandon God speak the loudest. In these passages, Jesus had the Holy Spirit to sustain him, helping him resist the Devil's enticement to renounce God and his authority as God.

Words from Our Pastor | Thoughts on Lent

Lent is our opportunity not to force ourselves into suffering but to find new ways to rely on the Holy Spirit. In a world where we get whatever we want, whenever we want, we find it surprisingly difficult to see ourselves in need of the Holy Spirit as much as we should!

For this reason, it is a normal custom of Christians to "give up something" for Lent. To give up a desire, a habit, or routine, and notice our desire to have it, consume it, or enjoy it. The idea is that on our own, you might be able to resist that temptation for a day or two, even a week! But a whole 40 days? It is there where you find yourself calling upon the Holy Spirit to sustain you and keep you focused and strong. In addition, try adding something to your life in Lent. Adding a new habit or discipline calls upon that same strength to keep at it, keep doing it, until it becomes a new routine or habit.

Just as Jesus relied upon and called upon the Holy Spirit to help him in his seasons of suffering and hardship, you can call upon that same Spirit in your own seasons of misery and adversity. May you find yourself willing to rely on the strength of the Holy Spirit more and more this Lenten season!
