# IAC TRACK AND FIELD BY-LAWS

#### General:

- 1. All IAC member schools shall conform to the New York State eligibility rules as outlined in the NYSPHSAA handbook from the year and the IAC Constitution.
- 2. Eligibility lists must be mailed as per Section 17,1B, C, and D page 12 of the IAC Constitution
- 3. The NYSPHSAA handbook, the National Federation Track & Field Rules, and all conference rules as agreed upon will govern meet standards
- 4. The order of events for a dual/triangular/quad meet shall be as in the IAC Track & Field booklet.
- 5. Both boys and girls may enter four events in league competition, as well as in Section IV Class Meet, State Qualifying meet, and the NYSPHSAA Championship meet.

Under NFHS Rule 4-2, Participation and Entry Limitations, a contestant shall not compete in more than four events, including relays. A contestant exceeds the participation limit whenever he/she reports to the clerk of the course, or the field event judge, in the excess event. The contestant may be listed on relay teams(s) but is not a competitor until he/she reports to the clerk of the course.

#### Contestants may officially enter

- Four Individual events No relays allowed.
- Three Individual events May be listed on any number of relays but compete in only one relay.
- Two Individual events May be listed on any number of relays but compete in only two relays.
- One Individual event May be listed on any number of relays but compete in only three relays.
- 6. A listing of the competitors and the events they will participate in is to be given to the opposing coach before the beginning of a dual/triangular/quad meet.
- 7. The conference schedule shall consist of at least one track and field meet against each participating school on one's division. Other meets may help fill out the schedule, but will not count towards the division title race. In the event, due to scheduling difficulties, two teams face each other more than once in a season; the first contest will count in the division standings.
- 8. Dual meets will determine the IAC Division Champions. IAC Team and Individual awards will be presented at the IAC Championship Meet. Protest must first go to the meet Grievance Committee appointed by the League Coordinator. If not satisfied, the protest may be entered with the IAC as per page 7, item 6 of the IAC League Constitution. A \$10.00 fee must accompany each protest and the Athletic Director, High School Principal must sign as well as the protesting coach.
- 9. IAC League Records can only be set in accredited meets. The IAC Record Application Form found in the Track & Field booklet must be submitted to the league coordinator no later than three weeks after the record was set.

### 10. Scratch one Scratch All:

- Rule takes affect once rosters are exchanged at dual meets
- If using an online entry system prior to a dual meet then a scratch can occur once coaches have met at the meet site and made final changes.
- After any changes then rule takes effect.
- If using online entry system opposing coach(es) may request the home team's roster at time of submission of entries

**11. Events not contested:** If a school cannot contest an event due to a lack of equipment or an unsafe facility (non-weather related) etc., the home school must provide prior notification in advance of the meet to all participating schools. The event in question will not count towards points in the meet. If an official deems a part of facility unsafe and an event can't be contested, prior to meet, then appropriate point will be awarded to visiting team(s) based on team rosters handed in prior to start of meet. Prior notification can be made at the preseason meeting for schools aware of such issues.

#### **IAC Championship:**

- Remove the IAC Pentathlon and allow schools the opportunity to offer this as an additional opportunity at their own discretion.
- Move the IAC Steeplechase from a single day event to the Championship Meet as the first event on Day
- Online entries are due two days prior to the meet. Team rosters will be sent out soon after all entries are received. Any changes must occur within 24 hours of first submission. After that period only scratches will be allowed.
- Team roster sheets will be turned in once coaches arrive at meet sight. These will be used for any scratches and proof that teams are there. After the team rosters are handed in then the scratch one scratch rest rule takes effect.
- If a two day meet occurs then scratching any time on day one does not affect the entries for the day two.
- Voting for MVPs for the Championship meet: Each school gets one vote for all 4 categories. In case of a tie when there are more the two athletes on the ballot, those that voted for other than the tied athletes will resubmit accordingly. If a tie occurs with only 2 athletes then it will be broken based on how high they are on positions on section 4 leaderboard.

#### IAC All Star Selection:

- IAC Overall All Stars are determined at the IAC Championship Meet. Places 1-3 are determined to be First Team All Stars, Places 4-6 are determined to be Second Team All Stars.
- IAC Small School and Large School All Stars are determined at the IAC Championship Meet. Places 1-3 are determined to be First Team All Stars, Places 4-6 are determined to be Second Team All Stars.

- An athlete may enter a maximum of 3 events per day; no more than two track events or two field events may be entered each day. If an athlete is participating in tow running events, the total distance may not exceed 2300 meters (Total distance refers to specific events, not total distance of heats). An athlete is limited to one running event if the distance of that event exceeds 2300 Meters. For this reason, the boys run a 1500 Meter Race instead of 1600 Meters so that distance athletes may compete in both the 1500 and the 800 Meter races. (1600 + 800 = 2400 and thus would exceed the 2300 Meter Rule).
- A 4K shot put must be used for boys and a 6lb girls must be used for girls. The shot may be rubber or metal
- Modified Track and Field Athletes need 10 Practices Prior to a Scrimmage and 15 Practices Prior to a Contest.
- The 1600 Meter Relay and the 2300 Meter Rule were approved by the NYSPHSAA during the 2003 Spring Season.
- Modified Athletes are permitted to participate in the Pole Vault.
- Modified Athletes are permitted to wear spikes. Approved by the NYSPHSAA during the 2018 Spring Season.

### IAC Championship Meet Information May 17th and 18th

- Online entries are due two days prior to the meet (May 15<sup>th</sup> 5:00pm). Team rosters will be sent out soon after all entries are received. Any changes must occur within 24 hours of first submission (May 16<sup>th</sup> 5:00pm). After that period only scratches will be allowed.
- Team roster sheets will be turned in once coaches arrive at meet sight. These will be used for any scratches, as well as relay names with alternates. After the team rosters are handed in then the scratch one scratch rest rule takes effect.
- If a two day meet occurs then scratching any time on day one does not affect the entries for the day two.
- Coaches will be assigned to help in a field event, or can request an event they would prefer.
- Voting for MVPs for the Championship meet: Each school gets one vote for all 4 categories. In case of a tie when there are more the two athletes on the ballot, those that voted for other than the tied athletes will resubmit accordingly. If a tie occurs with only 2 athletes then it will be broken based on how high they are on positions on section 4 leaderboard.
- IAC Overall All Stars are determined at the IAC Championship Meet: Places 1-3 are determined to be First Team All Stars, Places 4-6 are determined to be Second Team All Stars.
