

Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. — Matthew 21:24

²⁵Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ²⁶He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" ²⁷He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." ²⁸And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live." – Luke 10:25-28

I lived in a world in which children were seen and not heard. And for the most part, I was okay with that idea. We had a kid's table in the kitchen during Thanksgiving meals and generally, we ate first and then went off to play somewhere instead of waiting for the adults to finish their meals and hear their conversations. Along the same line of thinking, I grew up with another cliché that to this day still haunts me and it comes from one of my favorite presidents Abraham Lincoln, "Better to remain silent and be thought a fool than to speak and to remove all doubt." Sometimes it's associated with "foot in mouth disease" and "dumb questions." I hope that I'm not alone in my dislike of these notions.

Maybe it's fear that rules the day when children are dismissed because of their excessive inquisitiveness and wonder about the

world. Questions are not "stupid" or "smart". They are simply questions which are meant to inform and help us learn about the deeper truths about ourselves and the world we inhabit. Jesus used questions all the time to teach and he did not ever turn down answering a question which someone posed to him. In fact, Jesus tended to answer questions with more questions! And yet it seems that we have little time or patience to even consider the conversations that questions generate.

When I think about the issues that we face in our world, like racism, gender discrimination, diversity challenges, divorce, and estrangement, I come back to the same basic communication problem. Our lack of wonder and inquisitiveness about our neighbors whether in our own home, next door, or in another country. Wouldn't it be great if someone would take the time and ask us questions about us! How we feel or what we think? Would it be great if someone listened to our answers? Maybe we could explain our world a bit and maybe ask questions of our own!? Have we lost our ability to wonder? To imagine? To reach out and learn? I hope not!

Let's start at home. Ask your child what they love? Ask your spouse what they think? And listen for the answers! Don't jump right in about you...focus on them only them. Believe it or not, God does the same with us in Christ Jesus! It's how we grow...

Let us pray. Gracious Father, who came to be with us in Jesus the Emmanuel, open our hearts and minds to be inquirers and wonder about you and this wonderful world, so that we might grow into the fullness of your love and wisdom and know our neighbors as we learn to know ourselves, in Jesus' name. Amen.



A New Home for D.

D. wanted to become more connected to her community, while still ensuring she could receive the care she needed on a daily basis. Through LSI, D. has been able to enroll in the Host Homes program, which provides 24/7 care for individuals with disabilities and mental illness who thrive in a one-on-one setting instead of a busier group home environment.

D. was able to move into a private family home with her Host Homes mentor, Anita, and they have built a friendship and a shared social life. Anita is there to support D. as she works on her personal goals, while D. is still able to get the care she needs.

Currently, one of D.'s goals is to exercise and become more active in the community, so the duo enjoys shopping and walking around the local mall to stay active. Back at home, the two can work on skills – like hygiene and cooking – that make D. feel more independent and confident.

"I like helping D. and seeing her progress and growth in her daily living," Anita says. "When you and the person in your care begin living like a family, when they are able to trust you and open up, then you know you're getting somewhere."
