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DES MOINES — lowa lawyers again have given the state's jurists up for retention a big vote of confidence. Lawyers have said the 83 judges on November's ballot should retain their positions on the bench.

Every two years, Iowa voters are asked to vote on whether justices on the Supreme Court, through judges on the Court of Appeals, District, District Associate and Associate Juvenile Courts should be retained in office. The retention question always appears in even numbered years.

The lowa State Bar Association, in an effort to help the public know how its member attorneys who practice before the judges whose names appear on the ballot feel, conducts its statewide plebiscite before the election and makes its result public.

"The Iowa State Bar Association's plebiscite represents our effort, as a service to the people and their government, to provide the public with information based on the first-hand observations of its members."

This year there are a total of 83 Judges on ballots across the state. All voters will have the opportunity to vote on the statewide positions of Supreme Court justice and Court of Appeals judge. Each ballot will offer the names of local judges on the other courts.

Over 90 percent of Iowa lawyers in private practice voluntarily belong to The Iowa State Bar Association.

The results of The Iowa State Bar Association's plebiscite on the retention of judges whose names are on the November general election ballot are available below.
