February 14th is an important date for Hernando Beach residents, that is when our Hernando Beach Volunteer Fire Department will be the subject of a workshop at the Hernando County BOCC chambers. It is open to the public and Hernando Beach residents should attend to voice their concerns about the operations of our HBVFD and to make it known that we want an ALS fire engine to be stationed in Hernando Beach. Ambulance service can come from east of US Highway 19 but we want the ALS engine at our fire station full time, staffed and ready to respond to a medical emergency in Hernando Beach to stabilize and sustain the patient until an ambulance does arrive. Once the ambulance arrives to transport to a hospital then the ALS fire engine will return to our fire station.

Our Government Affairs committee is also working on the issue of a seafood processing plant that the owners of Hernando Beach Seafood have plans to establish on Shoal Line Blvd in the old Gulf Star Marina building across from their property abutting Marlin canal. This means that semi-trucks will be coming and going from the plant to take away the packaged seafood that has been offloaded from commercial fishing boats that will be traversing marlin canal and docking at the Hernando Beach Seafood boat slips on Marlin canal. HBPOA maintains that the Hernando Beach canal system was designed and built in the 1960's for residential use and traffic, not heavy commercial fishing traffic from large fishing trawlers.

We will have signup sheets at our February meeting for the Landscaping committee chaired by Gladys Moore, Government Affairs Committee chaired by Chuck Greenwell, and our Hospitality Committee which is chaired by Fran Baird. We welcome new committee members with fresh ideas and knowledge to contribute to the betterment of our beloved Hernando Beach, our little slice of paradise on the Gulf of Mexico.

See you at our next meeting, it is sure to be a good one, join us and find out what is happening in Hernando Beach.

The sea grass beds and the mangroves growing offer good habitat for all species of fish. Because of the delicate balance of nature in our area, we need to protect our habitat from any situations that will deter or destroy our coastline. Trash and other forms of pollution are a major source of destruction to the habitat of the area. Over commercialization could be a huge factor in the future depletion of the natural fisheries of the area. Today there is a complimentary balance between commercial and recreational fishing in Hernando Beach. I do not believe that making Hernando Beach a seaport would be beneficial to all concerned regarding protecting our natural environment.



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
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

### PILOF FEES BEING PROPOSED BY THE WATER COMPANY

PILOF is a way to keep from showing a property tax increase. Instead a fee is imposed by a utility company, such as water and wastewater. If it were put through as an increase on your property tax, it would be tax deductible. By applying it as a fee, it is a hidden fee that you get no tax deduction benefit from. There was supposed to be a PILOF Workshop held by the county today to allow public input. This item will be coming up as an agenda item for vote at one of the upcoming Board of County Commission meetings,



Financial Impact

The financial impact of the implementation of the PILOF would be to increase water (revenue account 3433001) and wastewater (revenue account 3435001) user rates / sales revenue by approximately \$1.4 million annually with a corresponding increase in operating expenses of the System of \$1.4 million for payment to the County resulting in no increase in net revenues to the System.

On August 9, 2016, the Hernando County Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") enacted Ordinance 2016-15, which in part, clarified and delineated the Board's authority to impose franchise fees on private water/wastewater/reclaimed water utilities and to impose a payment in lieu of franchise fees ("PILOF") on such County-owned systems (the "System").



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On August 23, 2016, the Board adopted Resolution 2016-130 authorizing the imposition and payment of the PILOF upon the System to compensate the County for the System's utilization of the County's rights-of-way. The proposed PILOF to be imposed on the System by the County shall be 4.5% of the revenue the County expects to derive from the System's sale of water and wastewater services.

Based on the implementation of the proposed PILOF, the proposed resolution amends Resolution 2014-63, Section 6, to increase water and wastewater utility rates effective with the date the Board approves the PILOF and through the remaining term of Resolution 2014-63, which is for the last three fiscal years (FY 17, 18, 19). The proposed resolution will increase the water and wastewater rates by 4.71% to fund the PILOF. The 4.71% is greater than the PILOF rate (4.5%) to account for loss revenues associated with customers conserving water whenever a rate increase is enacted.

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

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### LIKE IT - LOCK IT - KEEP IT



Vehicle Burglaries affect all of us. This is a crime of opportunity made easy by leaving valuables in plain sight. The **Hernando Beach Crime Watch** encourages everyone to hide and secure their valuables. It's easy to prevent being a victim of car related thefts: Most burglars will not break into a car if they can't see what they're getting - Don't leave valuables in plain sight!

### THE MESSAGE IS SIMPLE:

**Lock It:** Lock your vehicle every time you leave it unattended and take your valuables with you.

<u>Hide It:</u> Hide your valuables in your trunk, under the seats, in the glove box, or other compartments within the vehicle. Ideally, take your property with you.

**<u>Keep it:</u>** Personal responsibility is the best prevention to safeguard personal property and to prevent emergency dial 9-1-1.

Do not leave valuables inside your vehicle. When you park your car, remove cell phones, cameras, laptop computers, briefcases, backpacks, wallets and purses. Do not leave gift wrapped packages or other valuable items lying on the seat. Lock all your valuables in the trunk or glove compartment before you reach your destination or take them inside with you.

Lock your vehicle. Always close your windows and lock your vehicle.

Stow Valuables. If you are going to stow valuables, do it before you get into your car to drive to your next stop. Don't let the strap of your purse, camera bag, or golf bag show when you stow it.

Always assume a thief is watching you and outsmart them.

Make a police report if your car is burglarized, even if nothing or just change is taken. This will help the Sheriff's Office track patterns.
