# LAKEWOOD FOREST'S PATRIOTIC PARADE Saturday, July 4 at the Lakewood Forest Residents' Club

Make plans now to come out on **Saturday**, **July 4**, and join the neighborhood's celebration of the 244th anniversary of our nation's founding. The annual Patriotic Parade is a fun family event for all ages.

Due to COVID-19, the parade will operate differently this year to prevent the spread of the virus.

- LFCA encourages you to preregister by **July 1** online or with the form on page 4 of this newsletter to limit interactions between volunteers and participants.
- Residents are asked to social distance at least 6 feet whenever possible.
- Masks are not mandatory. However, we highly encourage residents to wear masks during registration and when indoors.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at the entrance of the clubhouse and in the pool area.
- A volunteer will be stationed at the water coolers handing out drinks instead of the usual grab your own.
- Any food served will have social distanced lines and individual condiments handed out by a volunteer.
- If you win an award, and do not wish to stay for the ceremony, we will get it delivered to you.


Due to COVID-19 the Civic Association is offering preregistration via a form in the *Civic* newsletter or online at www.LakewoodForestCivicAssociation.com by **July 1**. These options will allow neighbors that wish to participate in the parade but would like to limit their interactions with other residents to do so. Registration opens at 8:45 a.m. the day of the parade inside the LRC clubhouse for the walkers, bike riders, and wagon pullers/riders.

If you are in a decorated vehicle or are pulling a float, we will have curbside registration for you, or if you preregistered let the volunteer know when they approach your vehicle. All vehicles and floats will need to line up on Lakeview Place (the street running next to LRC that leads to The Woods Private School). The parade starts at 9:30 a.m. from the Lakewood Forest Residents' Club, 15006 Lakewood Forest Drive. All are welcome to participate in the parade, but only those who register are eligible to be judged for their costumes and decorations. See page 3 for judging information.

The parade will return to the LRC where we will gather in the pool area for post-parade activities. These include cooling down with ice-cold bottled water, the always popular freeze pops, food and the presentation of awards and trophies. The LRC pool will be open for all at no charge for the day, so bring or wear your bathing suit and take the LRC plunge.

#### **Parade Route**

At 9:30 a.m. the parade will be led by our constables and the Cypress Creek Fire Department. The route starts at the LRC Clubhouse and goes in clockwise fashion as follows – south on Lakewood Forest Drive to Park River Drive, left on Park River to Lakewood Forest, right on Lakewood Forest to Normont Drive, right on Normont to Tupperglen Drive, right on Tupperglen to Sandy Creek Drive, right on



Sandy Creek and follow the curve to Park River Drive, left on Park River to Lakewood Forest Drive, and left on Lakewood Forest back to the Lakewood Residents' Club and into the pool area through the pool gate.



## Kids and Teens – Get Some Exercise and Get Fit! LRC Swim Lessons and Stroke Practice


- For children and teens up to age 18

# Get ACC Approval Before Building!



### Harris County Public Health Notice:

# **Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)**

At this time, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the risk to the general public is considered to be low.

### **Symptoms**

Patients with confirmed COVID-19 infection have reportedly had mild to severe respiratory illness with symptoms. However, there have been deaths from COVID-19 infection. CDC believes at this time that symptoms of COVID-19 may appear in as few as 2 days or as long as 14 after exposure.

The following are typical symptoms of COVID-19:

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of Breath

### **Prevention and Protection**

There is currently no vaccine or specific treatments at this time for the COVID-19. The best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to this virus. As a reminder, HCPH always recommends everyday preventive actions to help avoid the spread of respiratory viruses, including:

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol based hand sanitizer.



- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with • unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home while you are sick.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, and then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

### **Recent Travel**

If you have recently traveled to where the virus has been confirmed (and/or have been in contact with someone who has) and now feel sick, contact your healthcare provider or your local health department immediately.

### **Future Information**


