# Dowsing for Gold in the Desert

Prospecting in the desert, an area which is almost destitute of moisture, is kind of risky for most people if they don't bring enough water.

Jim Anderson from Nevada, wrote me: "I have located a very good deposit of placer gold in the desert by dowsing with a Black Diamond pendulum. Last summer we got 48 ounces of fine gold and nuggets, but we almost perished in that desert when we lost all of our drinking water. This summer I'm going to dowse for water first. Do you think it is possible to locate water in an area where we are prospecting?"

I have dowsed a map where Jim and his family are prospecting and located several water bearing fissures carrying enough drinking water and only five feet below the surface.

Dowsing for water in an arid and barren desert is basically the same as dowsing for gold or anything else. All you have to do is hold up your pendulum or dowsing rods and ask yourself: "Give me the direction of a satisfying drinking waterbearing fissure close to the surface." Then the instrument will swing in the direction to the nearest point of the stream. Now if you like the instrument to react, if and where there is a deposit of something beneath your feet, frame that question, that compound sample, as clearly and precisely as possible. That's important! Now follow the line of the swing that is giving you the direction of the water stream. We call that tracing. Don't walk too fast, otherwise you will pass the stream without getting a reaction. As soon as you approach the stream. the instrument oscillation should change to gyrations. This is the usual reaction to an object of search and the rods will cross over or move

outwards.

Dowsing for water came in handy, during the landing of American forces in Morocco, commanded by General George Patton. The Germans had blown up all the water wells in the area when they landed not too far from Casablanca. Army Engineers were drilling in the sandy desert to no avail. A lot of water was being pumped ashore from ships and trucked to the troops. It was so hot that the troops showed that they could fry an egg on the top of their tanks.

One of the Army geologists said that there was no way they could pinpoint water without first bulldozing the sand away so they could see the underlying formation. But when they captain found how badly the Army needed water, he decided to inform General Patton that he could locate water by dowsing. But he had a heck of a time trying to get in to see the General.

Finally, he succeeded to come face to face with Patton. When he told the General what he could do, the General only asked, "What do you need Captain?" The Captain replied, "All I need is a forked willow switch." Patton immediately reached for his field telephone, called his Air Corps commander and said, "I want a willow tree flown in here as soon as possible!"

The commander must have asked a rude question, because Patton shouted, "No I'm not crazy! I want a willow tree! I don't give a damn where you get but I want it here on the double!"

The next day the tree was ion his office, about the height of his room, with plenty of cuttable forked switches in it. The Captain cut one

We need you to look for the sign-up sheet that will be on display at the July Membership Meeting and volunteer to bring a salad dish, chips,




condiments, and other items as well. Look for the sheet at the meeting.



# Facts about gold from the Gold Institute

- The first gold nugget discovered in the United States was in North Carolina in 1799.
- One ounce of gold can be drawn into 50 miles of gold wire.
- Modern applications of gold include the circuitry controlling airbags, electronics for wireless voice, data and video communications, radar equipment and personal computers.
- \* The total amount of gold produced world wide is more than 115,000 tons of gold, which would measure about 58 cubic feet.
- \* Gold was used as a medium of exchange for trade by the Egyptians in 1500 B.C.
- The first pure gold coins were from Lydia, in Asia Minor in 560 B.C.

(Continued from page 3) and went out and located what seemed to be an underground river, 300 feet wide and 400 feet down to


300 feet wide and 400 feet down to the water running under the desert.

He took a Colonel of the Corps of Engineers out there to show him where to drill. But the Colonel said that there can't be any water down there. The Captain challenged him. "Colonel," he said, "Would you like to bet some money on that? How about \$5,000. I've got that much in my account. Would you like to put up \$5,000 that there is no water here? Would you like to do that Colonel?"

But the Colonel wouldn't bet him. So they drilled a well down and got 2,000 gallons of water per minute. The Captain then dowsed similar wells for the Army in other desert areas. You can find an underground river about every few misleads in the country. The Captain located a lot of water whenever they needed it, a total of 17 big wells.

Captain Harris should have been promoted to Major, and if he had asked, I know General Patton would have given it to him. He was a rough man, but he was fair and was a genius.
