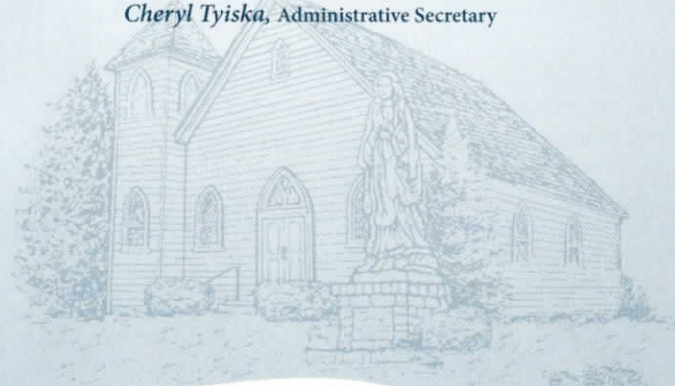

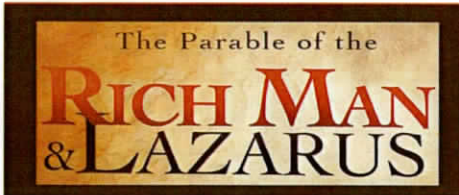

This parable is part of Jesus' response to some Pharisees, who are described as "loving money." The Pharisees taught an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses as the basis for popular Jewish piety. They put less emphasis on Temple worship and more on applying the law to everyday life. Though they are often portrayed negatively in the Gospels, they shared many of Jesus' and the early Church's concerns about the law. Jesus observed that the actions of some Pharisees betrayed misplaced priorities: they spoke one way but acted in another. The story of the rich man and Lazarus demonstrates the importance of the care of the poor and is a reminder to those who would follow Jesus of the unimportance of wealth in the eyes of God. *(Redacted from Sunday Connection, Loyola Press)*

Young women between the ages of 14 through 50 come to the Center for help dealing with their unplanned pregnancy. Trained counselors, who are volunteers, speak with these women offering them guidance, support, and solutions. All the services given by the Forestville Pregnancy Center are FREE. This includes: pregnancy testing, limited first and second trimester ultrasounds, material assistance, educational literature, counseling, and referrals. Starting October 5/6, before all the Masses, Frank and Jeanette Zak will be passing out baby bottles for you to take home. You may take as many bottles as you would like. Bring one to your office, keep one at home, or let your children have their own bottle. The object is to fill up the bottle with cash, change or checks.
