## **Healthy Lifestyle to Help Avoid Prostate Cancer**

This paragraph is for the men. A healthy lifestyle may substantially reduce the risk of dying from prostate cancer, according to a new analysis of two studies involving 63,000 male health professionals (ages 40 to 64) in the *Journal of the National Cancer Institute*.

HEALTHY

The researchers followed the men for at least 10 years, looking at six lifestyle habits that have been linked to reduced risk of advanced prostate cancer: exercising vigorously; not smoking (at least for the last 10 years); maintaining a healthy weight; eating fatty fish (at least once a week); eating tomato products (rich in lycopene) most days; and limiting processed meat (no more than three servings a week). Men who had at least five of these healthy habits were about half as likely to die from prostate cancer as those who had only one or none. The biggest benefit appeared to come from vigorous exercise. The eating part of this diet does not sound hard to follow however the vigorous exercise should be discussed with your physician if this has not been a part of your daily routine.
