If you feel inspired, come wearing your finest green clothing items so the Luck 'o the Irish may be with you and so you don't get pinched 😊

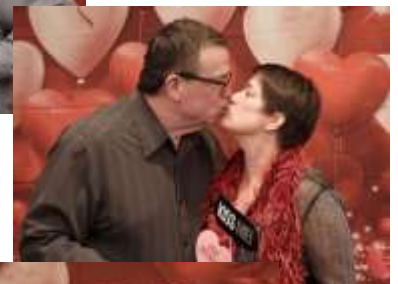
