Principal's Message:

Sometimes, parents and people in positions of authority (e.g. teachers) need to exercise 'tough love' to bring appropriate consequences to inappropriate behaviour. In friendships, colleague relationships, and daily interactions, however, Jesus taught us by example to show abundant grace and self sacrifice even in cases when we might prefer to fight for our rights or to demand justice for every real or perceived slight. In his first letter to the Corinthians, the Apostle Paul admonished the church in Corinth for its self-focused, power-hungry, and retaliatory tendencies, explaining that Christ-like love "doesn't keep score of the sins of others, doesn't revel when others grovel ... puts up with anything, trusts God always, always looks for the best, never looks back, and keeps going to the end" [1 Cor 13:5-7 (The Message)]. When conflicts arise, let's consider the perspectives of the other, and choose love.



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"Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends..." 1 Corinthians 13:4-8




Science Fair
