- First: Mayor Matt Seale called the meeting to order and determined a quorum, prayer by Police Chief Billy Hancock, and then the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was pledged and spoken by everyone.
- Second: Motion by Councilwoman Patrice Y.W. Manley and 2nd by Councilman Lemora Moses to adopt a relaxed Agenda for Tuesday, March 3, 2020.
All in favor say I – Voted 5 yes; Opposes none - Motion passed.
- Third: Motion by Councilman Lemora Moses and 2nd by Councilwoman Claire Clayton for the approval and adopting of the Minutes from the Regular Meeting of February 10, 2020.

Mayor Seale said that he discussed the mowing with Assistant Public Works Director Corneilus Hall and Mr. Hall said he would put it on the work schedule.

RESOLUTION
OF THE CITY OF OCILLA
TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO OBTAIN
FY 2020 REVITALIZATION AREA STRATEGY DESIGNATION
FOR NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION

WHEREAS, the City of Ocilla has identified a lack of sufficient funds to address the need for Neighborhood Revitalization; and

WHEREAS, The Revitalization Area Strategies (RAS) designation provides incentives to communities who implement comprehensive redevelopment activities for targeted areas in their city or county; and

WHEREAS, The program rewards innovative local strategies and a commitment to redevelop a targeted area with a comprehensive, collaborative approach that includes public and private partners; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ocilla has requested the staff of the Southern Georgia Regional Commission to assist in the preparation of the FY 2020 Revitalization Area Strategies (RAS) application; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ocilla has agreed to provide sufficient matching funds and in-kind services to make this strategy a success;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the City of Ocilla will submit a FY 2020 Revitalization Area Strategies (RAS) application to address Neighborhood Revitalization.
