Trouble Shooting *Your Own* Canine Glitches

Canine problems come in large and small: hyperactivity and fear as well as slow sits and lagging at heel.

There are tons of trainers and gurus that will tell you, “Bring your dog to me and *I* will fix it!”

Wouldn't it be nice if you could acquire the tools to fix it yourself?

Solving Problems is a two day seminar that helps *you* become a more effective teacher—someone who can come up with the right tool/technique to identify and fix problems as they arise.

The first part of the seminar identifies the tools that you will need to identify, break down and then develop a lesson plan to fix your dog's issue.

The second part takes random teams from the participants and asks them what problem they would like to work on. **The problem can be anything that we can replicate at the seminar**—obedience, rally, agility, behavior even herding or barn hunt if the critters are around!

This is not a dog training clinic. There aren't “10 working slots and X auditor slots.”

In this seminar Everybody works. Everybody participates.

Although you are encouraged to bring your dog and a training issue, there is no guarantee that your specific team's issue will be addressed. Illustrative training issues are randomly drawn from the pool of participants throughout the day.
