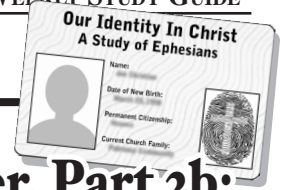
5. Explain how it is possible to have peace when your circumstances may be traumatic and painful. Defend your answer.
