# News From Pastor Ryan:

Hello Brothers and Sisters.

It's, of course, that time of year when everyone makes New Year's Resolutions! Everybody wants to get into better shape, read more, spend less time on phones or watching TV. There's any number of positive life changes that people are trying to make! Sadly, we know many of us will struggle to keep up these changes and soon settle back into our old ways.

As a church, I always want us moving forward. We want to always be looking for where God is calling us next, both congregationally and individually. The church recently approved the establishment of a 2030 committee designed to brainstorm and research positive pathways forward for the next 10 years to help us living out our mission!

But what is our mission? Like all churches, we are called to make disciples! Jesus said "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20). Built into our Christian faith is the idea that we go out into the world and teach others about Jesus and help them grow in faith. In fact, we walk alongside them! As we grow in faith, we help others grow in faith! In theory, this means we are working together as a community, worshipping God, teaching others, growing together and serving that community. This is why to start the year I'm teaching on our 2020 Vision. We're going to be disciple makers. Everyone is in a different place on their faith journey. We might be strong in one area of faith, but need work in another. I see four areas that we should be working, as a church and individuals, to strengthen our faith.

**COME:** This is the vital first step. We have to come to church (if able, more on that later). There are so many people in our area who are hurting. They are searching for their identity and a place to belong. They are searching for hope. We believe that hope comes in Jesus Christ. But, most of them will need invited in. Were you invited to our church? Have you ever invited others? Finding people in our community who need to experience Jesus is important to the goal of disciple making!

**CONNECT:** It's not enough to just share the same space with someone. We want to connect with people, and connect people with God. There's a difference between being invited somewhere, and truly belonging. We want to create opportunities to grow in friendship and fellowship, and also engage in vibrant worship and prayer to God. This connection point is the difference between being a "collection of people" vs. a "community of people".

**GROW:** Maybe you do come to church. Maybe you even feel very much connected to what goes on. But are you growing? Are you studying God's word more deeply? Are you learning new things? Are you finding new expressions of worship? We believe that God creates a newness within us, and in that newness growth happens! Growth might mean we react differently at home, at school, or at work because of how God is working in us. Growth means we are ready to take the next steps of faith.

**GO:** Once we've been invited, connected, and has some growth, we realize that the Bible tells us to GO OUT! We become the recipients of the Great Commission! "Go and make disciples". It also means service! When we more fully understand the Gospel message, we are compelled to go out and share the Kingdom of God with others. We want to share love, hope, and serve all around us that they may know the goodness of our God! "Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant." (Mark 10:43)

This is the vision I have for a path to discipleship. It's no uncommon for people to have skipped a step along the way. It's not uncommon for people to get stuck somewhere either! On our faith journey we will often find ourselves cycling through one phase or the another. It is my prayer that in 2020 we all take the next step in our faith to be full disciples of Christ! Happy New Year!
