Blast From the Past Dorothy Trigg

On Saturday, I had the honor of traveling to Harrisburg with our archivist Mike Bannon to attend a conference on Parish and Diocesan archives. While there, I looked at our parish box, and found some more documents on the history of the Parish that I would like to share with you. Shippensburg had had a parish in the 1800s that was made up of mostly Irish Catholics that were working on the railroad (since these were migrant workers, and had to travel with the work, they left Shippensburg which was why there was no church from the mid- 1800s until the 1950s). Despite the absence of a physical church, Catholic community was still very much aware of its history not only in Shippensburg, but in Pennsylvania. This is shown by a newspaper article I found in the box from August 14, 1942.

Note: The original Church was called St. Mary of the Visitation, and though the Chapel was gone the community still referred to itself as the parish of the Visitation.

Marking 100 years of the existence of the Catholic Church in Shippensburg, the Catholic Church in the community of the Chapel of the Visitation will celebrate their centennial with a public service at 12 o' clock noon Sunday in the public school auditorium.

The celebration will be in the form of a solemn high mass to be sung by the acting pastor, Father John C. Baker of the Society of Jesus, assisted by Father William C Bier of Washington D.C., as deacon, and Father Luis M. Torralba of the Philippine Islands as sub-deacon. Father Bier and Father Torralba are also members of the Society of Jesus, whose priests of early days spread the gospel through many sections of rural Pennsylvania.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE


Bishop Ronald Gainer will open the Forty Days for Life Campaign across the street from Planned Parenthood, 727 S. Beaver St., York, on **Monday, September 25th at 11 am**. The program will open with prayer and words of encouragement from Bishop Gainer, followed by music, life-related testimonies, 40 Days for Life best practices, and refreshments.

Then, from September 27th to November 5th, the York community will continue the vigil for a full '40 days for life.' The campaign is made up of three components: Prayer and Fasting, Peaceful Vigil, and Community Outreach. The Peaceful Vigil location will be on the public sidewalks outside of the Planned Parenthood Clinic at 728 South Beaver Street, York.

Please consider standing for life locally in York during this campaign for 1 hour or more per week or for any time you can spare. In any given week, 15-20 babies lives are ended at the Planned Parenthood in York, so please join us in defending life locally, right in here in central Pennsylvania!

40 Days for Life has generated proven life-saving results since its beginning in 2004 in College Station, Texas. There have been 13,305 babies saved, 154 abortion workers convinced to leave their jobs, and 86 abortion clinics closed during the campaigns.

D., J.C.L., Bishop of the Diocese of Harrisburg, will be the principal celebrant at the Red Mass on Monday, September 18, 2017, at 5:30 PM at The Cathedral Parish of St. Patrick, 212 State Street, Harrisburg. The homilist will be the Most Reverend David A. Zubik, Bishop of Pittsburgh. All who attend the Red Mass are invited to greet Bishop Gainer and Bishop Zubik after the Mass. At the Red Mass, lawyers, judges, lawmakers, and public officials gather together to pray for God's wisdom and guidance in their pursuit of justice. The Red Mass originated in medieval England at the time of King Edward I, when the twelve judges of the High Court attended Mass as a group on the opening day of the judicial calendar. The Red Mass generally coincides with the time period in which the U.S. Supreme Court begins its new term. The Saint Thomas More Society of Central Pennsylvania, an organization of Catholic lawyers, sponsors the Red Mass each year. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Considerations and Responses to Certain Comments

- Several parishioners commented about the noise and loud talking in the back of the church before and during Mass. Although it may be unreasonable to ask for total silence in the vestibule, I do ask everyone to be mindful of the fact that there are people who are praying in the church. Please be considerate of them.
- During Mass, please focus on Jesus and avoid chatter.
- OLV parish will NOT be ending the use of contribution envelopes. That is not something we have ever even considered.
- Based on the responses, the finance council will need to consider whether it is to our advantage to offer online giving in light of the number of people who said they would use it.
- If you use the online giving option, there is no fee charged to the parishioner. However, the parish would be paying for the service. That is why the finance council will need to consider whether we have enough people to justify using an online giving program.
- If we begin passing the collection basket just once at each Mass, this would not at all have any impact on our diocesan assessment. The diocese assesses all of the money that goes into the first collection- even if it is for the building fund, the youth education outreach or social outreach. The parish is not assessed for contributions to the Lenten Appeal or for votive candle money.
- There was an idea on one of the surveys regarding how we pass the basket for the second collection. It seems like a good idea. At this point, I am considering that idea, because it may be "the best of both worlds" so to speak. For now, no change to the usher procedure will happen before December 2, 2017, the first Sunday of Advent.
- Because of the overwhelming support of going to one hardback hymnal (which contains the Sunday readings) we will begin using the new hymnal the first Sunday of Advent (December 2, 2017). There is a hymnal that I have in mind, but I will be checking into whether or not it is the best option for us.
- For daily Masses, there will be a hardback Missal that will contain not only the responsorial psalms and antiphons, but also the full text of the readings for daily Mass.
- Thank you again for your input! May God bless this wonderful parish community!
