



## Public Education Fellowship

### Responsibilities:

- Works with the Chief Curator to engage K-12<sup>th</sup> grade stakeholders during the planning stages of a new core exhibition titled *You Are Here*.
- Develops STEM-based educational activities and curriculum supporting *You Are Here*.
- Researches historic themes, topics, and points of interest using primary and secondary sources to enhance educational programming.
- Participates in promotional activities in support of the History Museum.
- Leads public education activities including school visits and adult walking tours.

### Other:

- Works rotating weekend shifts and off-business hours as necessary.
- Delivers excellent customer service.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

### Qualifications:

- Recent college graduates or young professionals with less than two years relevant work experience.
- Master's degree in history, art history, public history, museum studies, education, or related field.
- Demonstrated written and communication skills.
- Knowledge of American history.
- Familiarity with computer databases.
- Careful attention to detail.
- Ability to commit 40 hours per week during a one-year fellowship with the potential of a second year.

### Compensation:

- \$32,000 - \$38,000 annually throughout the fellowship.
