⚭ Yom HaShoah Wednesday, May 1 at 7:00 p.m.
The greater Englewood/Tenafly Community is invited to attend a Yom HaShoah commemoration at Cong. Ahavath Torah, 240 Broad Ave. in Englewood. This year we are undertaking two very special projects. We will be displaying an exhibit of artifacts and heirlooms from before or during the Holocaust, all belonging to families connected to Keshet, Ahavath Torah, East Hill Synagogue, and Kol HaNeshamah. We have also collected 525 names of Holocaust victims and survivors who have passed away—all tied to the Englewood/Tenafly community—and we will be learning the complete Mishna in their memory, culminating in a siyum on May 1.

If you have family heirlooms or artifacts from before or during the Holocaust that you would like to lend to the communal exhibit, please email YomHaShoah2019@gmail.com. These items might include photographs, Judaica, clothing, books, documents—any mementos precious to your families.
