

meet every other Tuesday at 7:00 p.m. in the church narthex.


The studies, led by Steve Hanna, focus on various books of the Bible. They cover a chapter each meeting with much discussion.

#### **MISSION & OUTREACH** FOCUS


Thank you to everyone who has donated items for the New Life Center during No-

In January, our focus will be on the Matthew's Voice Project, a local group that works with high school students experiencing homelessness in West Fargo, Fargo, and Moorhead. They work directly with the homeless liaison contacts in each high school to provide immediate needs.
