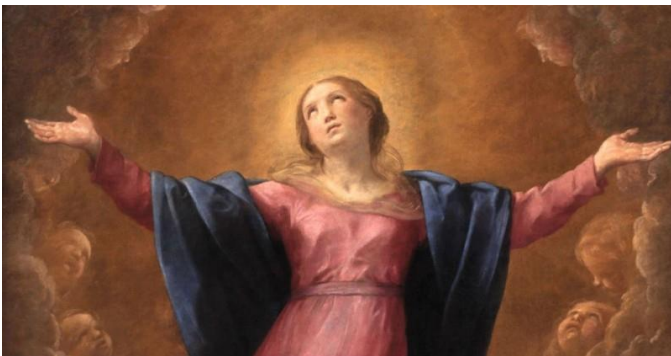

THE ASSUMPTION of MARY



The Assumption of Mary is a Catholic doctrine of faith stating that Mary, the Mother of Jesus, was assumed (or, taken up) body and soul into Heaven at the end of her life.

The Catholic Church teaches that Mary's body was glorified immediately at the end of her earthly life. Thus, unlike other mortal beings who must wait until the end of the world for our bodily resurrection, Mary, as Jesus's mother, was given the divine gift of being taken body and soul to Heaven upon her death. †

LITURGICAL COLORS

GREEN: Ordinary Time. Signifies hope.

RED: Pentecost the Holy Spirit. Feast of the Apostles and martyrs. Signifies the fire of charity and the blood shed for Christ.

Gold or White: Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Mary and saints who were not martyred. Symbolizes glory, joy, innocence and purity of soul.

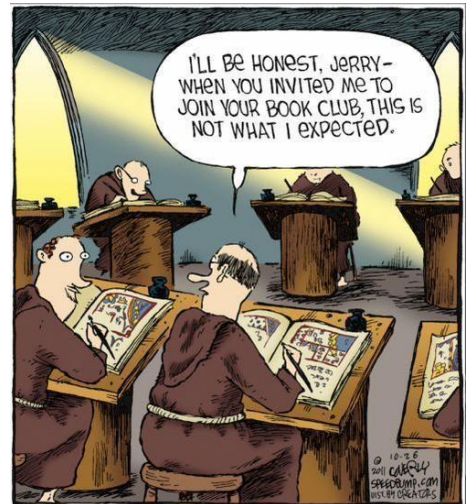
Rose: Third Sunday of Advent and Fourth Sunday of Lent. Symbolizes joy and love.

Purple: Advent and Lent, also in Requiem Masses. Signifies humility and penitence.

A Requiem or Requiem Mass, also known as Mass for the dead (Latin: Missa pro defunctis) or Mass of the dead (Latin: Missa defunctorum), is a Mass offered for the repose of the soul or souls of one or more deceased persons, using a particular form of the Roman Missal. It is usually, but not necessarily, celebrated in the context of a funeral.
