
Above the Ceiling



Luncheon Recap by Joseph Nuncio, Secretary

Thank you to Jeree DeVisser with TRANE for taking the time to speak to the SAABE community on the importance of water treatment in varying HVAC applications.

In our profession, some of us are faced with a facet of the HVAC process that involved circulating water to transfer and dissipate heat. These are Cooling Towers and the like. Mr. DeVisser reminded us that having the water chemically treated property is very vital to the operation and life span of our systems.

Good water is not only important to human health, but to HVAC health as well. Why do we treat water? To lessen scale build-up, corrosion and biological growth and to remove other foulants that can be introduced into the HVAC system through the water.

Any of these anomalies, especially over time if untreated, can wreak havoc on an HVAC system. Scale, corrosion and growth can be very costly to try and remove once it has been given the opportunity to take a stronghold. This also reduces the overall system efficiency and makes for higher operating costs since the unit has to now work harder to achieve the desired results.

Please remember to be PRO-active in treating your water to avoid unnecessary pitfalls. The good people at TRANE offer software that helps you track real data with the condition of your water as it is happening and allows one to see trends, detailed graphs and patterns. Such a tool could be critical for your HVAC unit's overall performance.

So remember, healthy water, healthy system.
