* **WORKSHOP FOR WRITERS** — Saturday, March 25th from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Leake Center. Handouts, refreshments and light lunch are included in the cost. Two successful authors from the Sacramento area will be the instructors. Registration is required as seating is limited. The speakers, Rae James and Susan Spann have conducted several workshops so you will leave with a lot of valuable information. Spread the word to friends and family. The cost is \$20.00 for Friends members and \$25.00 for nonmembers.

* **BUNCO AFTERNOON** — Saturday, April 1st (no fooling) starting at 1:30 p.m. in the Leake Center. Make plans to come and invite friends and family to a fun afternoon of bunco, refreshments, prizes, and visiting. Cost will be \$15.00.

* **NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK** — April 9-15. D. E. A. R. (Drop Everything And Read) is the whole month of April. An especially good time to visit the Library and discover new books to read.

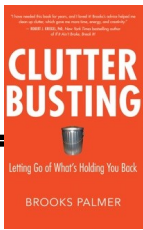

Post Event Perspective: Clutter Busting with Brooks Palmer By: Bernadette Murray

Mindfulness practice does NOT always mean sitting cross-legged on a zazen pillow with eyes closed. And as I was delighted to learn, cultivating an attitude of non-attachment in a loving-kindness manner forms the core of Brooks Palmer approach to “clutter-busting.”

I joined a packed room to listen his interactive presentation on February 1, 2017.

Brooks, a former stand-up comedian in LA and Chicago, now lives in Sebastopol. Rather than present a scripted stilted “The 10 steps to getting organized and clutter-free FOREVER”, Brooks started off by by inviting us audience members to relinquish the notion that clutter is a fixed category that looks pretty much the same for everyone. Rather we are not static and unchanging and likewise neither are our relationships --whether those relationships are to objects or people in our lives. “Clutter” in this sense refers to whatever we are holding onto “that no longer useful to” us.

Brooks then (without using the term “mindfulness”) engaged folks with two seemingly simple questions that he asks his clients to guide them in recognizing clutter and letting it go.

(He encourages his clients to touch the item while answering these questions) “Do you **like** it and do you **use** it?”

One woman asked whether she liked the blouse she was wearing, responded “I LOVE IT!” Definitely not clutter Brooks noted. In contrast, if we hesitate rather than immediately responding “Yes” to the 2 questions above, the item is clutter.

So once we recognize clutter, the next step is letting go of it. Brooks, a master of storytelling, shared some poignant examples of supporting his clients as they began to recognize what they were really clinging to in holding onto stuff they no longer liked or used.

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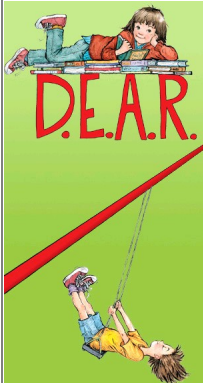
What is D.E.A.R.?

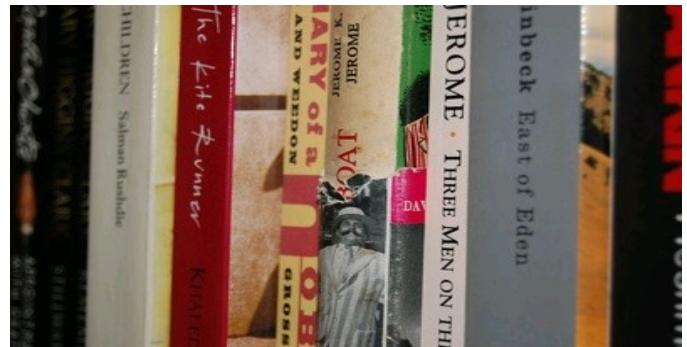

Writers' Workshop at the Library March 25

The Friends of the Woodland Public Library (FOL) are pleased to offer a special workshop for aspiring writers on Saturday, March 25, 2017 from 8am to 1pm. Lunch and handout materials are included in the registration fee of \$20 (FOL members)/\$25 (non-members). Register for the Writers' Workshop on the FOL website (www.woodlandfol.org). Attendance is limited, so advanced registration is highly encouraged. If space permits, sign-ups will be taken on the day of the event for an additional \$5 fee.

Have you ever wanted to write and publish a book? This workshop will be a fantastic opportunity to find out how, from those who have done it: authors Rae James and Susan Spann. In addition to covering the nuts and bolts of writing and publishing, this workshop can provide answers to your technical and legal questions since Susan is a publishing attorney.

R. (Rae) Franklin James grew up in the San Francisco Bay Area and graduated from the University of California at Berkeley in Psychology. She went on to complete the master's program at Cal State Hayward where she studied Public Policy. After a career of public service, she retired to focus on her first love, writing, and in 2013 her debut novel in the five star Hollis Morgan Mystery Series, *The Fallen Angels Book Club*, was published by Camel Press. Four books later, her current book, *The Trade List*, was published in 2016. Her fifth book in the series, *The Bell Tolls* will be released in May 2017.

Susan Spann began reading precociously and voraciously from her preschool days in Santa Monica, California, and as a child read everything from National Geographic to Agatha Christie.

A yearning to experience different cultures sent Susan to Tufts University in Boston, where she immersed herself in the history and culture of China and Japan. After earning an undergraduate degree in Asian Studies, Susan diverted to law school. She returned to California to practice law, where her continuing love of books has led her to specialize in intellectual property, business and publishing contracts. Susan's first novel, *Claws of the Cat: A Shinobi Mystery* (Minotaur Books, 2013) was named a Library Journal mystery debut of the month and was a finalist for the Silver Falchion Award for Best First Novel. Susan is the 2015 Rocky Mountain Fiction Writers' Writer of the Year, a former president of the Northern California Chapter of Mystery Writers of America and a member of Mystery Writers of America, Sisters in Crime (National and Sacramento chapters), the Historical Novel Society, and the Rocky Mountain Fiction Writers.

Woodland Public Library's facility master plan

Woodland Public Library is conducting a process to gather community input to shape a long-term master plan for its facility to guide how the library can best serve its community for future generations. The Library anticipates that the Facility Master Plan will form the foundation of a future building program for the expansion and/or renovation of the existing library to meet the community's learning needs, abilities, demographics, and changes in technology.

The facility master planning process will assess the current state of facilities; analyze community and library use demographics; create a common vision based on community input; and consider new library service possibilities.

Timeline:

- **Winter 2017:** Assess current facilities; gather feedback; analyze demographic and use data; develop use/need projections; hold Facility Master Plan Workshops with stakeholder and community input.
- **Winter 2017:** Analyze space needs and options; gather feedback; analyze feedback; define community need; create customer experience vision
- **Spring 2017:** Consider funding strategies; create master plan; present final document to Woodland Public Library Board of Trustees

All proceeds benefit our library. Here are just some of the things the FOL help make happen: Commit2Fit speakers and activities; children's story times in English and Spanish; summer reading programs; author speakers; teen programming and the Teen Advisory Board; adult programming including adult literacy, reading initiatives, and educational lectures; and our town's Little Free Libraries.

The Friends also contribute to the library's biggest upcoming project, our new Makerspace, currently under construction. A 1600 square foot storage space has been cleared out and is now on its way to becoming a valuable community resource. Five maker areas are planned which will house a 3D printer and laser cutter, a woodshop with hand tools and router, a textile/arts area with sewing machines, screen printing, and vinyl cutter, and an electronic arts area equipped for robotics work and computer/digital/graphic arts.

Fundraisers like our Bunco event allow us to contribute financially to our library and to raise awareness of the many programs our library has to offer.

FOL membership is currently half off the regular price, for new members only. Membership will be valid through June 30, 2017 and will include all members-only activities, discounts, and freebies.
