Wesley, Iowa is the hometown of two really good ballplayers. One, George "Showboat" Fisher, played in the major leagues in the '20s and '30s while the second, Dick Bleich, currently plays in the Sun Lakes Senior Softball League. Wesley's a small farming community thirteen miles east of Algona in northern Iowa. Dick was a standout on Algona's Bishop Garrigan Golden Bears' basketball, baseball, football and track teams. As a senior, he was MVP of the football team as a bruising halfback and defensive back while also being voted Homecoming King.

Dick attended junior college for a year before enlisting in the Air Force. He served four years as an aircraft technician while stationed in Okinawa, then stateside in Omaha. Upon his discharge he returned to farming in Iowa.
