<u>The Industrial Heritage of</u> <u>Leyland & Farington – Recording</u> <u>the workforces of the town</u>

I am very pleased to announce that the Leyland Historical Society has been successful in obtaining a Heritage Lottery Grant for our Oral History project.

The grant will enable the Society to undertake a number of events over the next two years. These include

1. To print a second edition of the Society's 2010 publication "The Industrial Heritage of Leyland and Farington".

This has returned from the printers in its new expanded 124 page, full coloured and updated form and is available tonight.

2. To train at least 10 members or any others who may wish to be involved, in recording a minimum number of 100 oral histories. A second round of interviews will also involve history students from UCLAN.

This is where **YOU** come in, if you would like to be involved in the interviewing let the committee know. We also need a much larger database of prospective interviewees. So if you worked in any of the factories in Leyland and Farington,

we need your details, please ask family, friends or neighbours.

3. To open a pop up Heritage Centre in a vacant town centre shop to showcase the society's work, promote the project to potential volunteers and interviewees, deliver a programme of talks and historical walks and invite visits from schools and other groups.

We are aiming to open the Heritage Centre from Monday 21st May until the first week of July. Days and hours of opening to be arranged when we have the volunteers in place.

4. At a later date we will look to visit care homes and day care centres to give presentations, facilitate reminiscence sessions and collect people's memories about working in Leyland's industries.

We will then transcribe the interviews and publish them to the website, books and on CD / DVD to be distributed to local schools, colleges, societies, libraries etc.
