


FALL BACK

al theology and behavior. It may be a relative, a friend, a teacher, or an author you read that made a difference in the relationship you have with God. Ponder...and give God thanks for those special people you have been fortunate to have in your life.

November is also the month of giving

thanks. There are times when it feels like we jump from Halloween to Christmas, forgetting about Thanksgiving and all it means. Recently I read an article that reported the very act of giving thanks has decreased over the years. What can you do to increase the act of giving thanks in your life?

Practice gratitude. It is a choice we each make when we start our day. We choose if we want to be crabby or not. When you see only the things you do not like about your life, or others, you might notice

yourself complaining about things, or only talking about the negative news.

Instead you can choose to view life from a positive perspective. Reflect upon what is right with your world rather than focusing on the negative in your life, or the life of others. Start with the simple things of life...you woke up to a new day, you have a roof over your head, blankets to keep you warm, and food to eat. Look for the positive in those around you.

Share your faith with others. Take time to read your Bible. Both the Old Testament and the New Testament have scriptures to remind us how important it is to give God thanks, and to be kind to others. Here are a few scripture verses to read during November: Exodus 15:1-19 known as "The Song of the Sea," one of the oldest literary units in the Bible. Moses and the Israelites sang the song to the Lord with gratitude. Psalm 9 is a song of thanks as is Psalm 100 and 107. In Psalms, many are focused on the

negative or lament, yet also include praising and giving thanks to God. In the New Testament, one of the well-known parables is about the cleansing of the ten lepers (Luke 17:11-19), where only one thanked God for his healing. The point of this passage, and others, is that we have been given forgiveness and grace along with other gifts. Ex-

pressing gratitude to God is not required, however, if we truly are grateful, our thanks naturally spills out and we can't help being positive, grateful, and thank God. Other scripture passages about the importance of being thankful and full of gratitude can be found in Colossians 3:15-17 and 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18.

We have much to be grateful for here at Community Presbyterian Church of West Fargo. We have a community of Christians who are committed to serving the Lord in many ways. Together we mourn those

saints who are no longer with us. Together we rejoice when we baptize, when we welcome new members, and we work together to nurture one another as we journey with God through Christ Jesus.




