Scints of the GOURD VINE

I invite you to go with me to the Text (Jonah, chapters 3 and 4), and take a look at the meaning of it. "Saints of the Gourd Vine." 'Many of us today are like Jonah, who was so worried about the gourd vine that he could not get it off his mind. Too many of us are more occupied with the gourd vine of our comfort than burdened over the need of a lost world. The world is in sin and ruin while many of us are doing little or nothing to try to reach the lost with the Gospel of Christ. We may see the vision of a lost and dying world without the knowledge of the wonderful Lord! Many claim to be Spirit-filled and blessed with the gifts of the Spirit, but are putting them to no use.

We have preached to various types of congregations. We have ministered to listeners in some of our churches who are what we call worldly: they know next to nothing of the Bible; they smoke, or play bridge, and go to the movies. I have preached to others who were out-right sinners, making no profession to know Christ. We find it easier any day to awaken these people than to arouse the action of many of the smug saints comfortably resting under their gourd vine. "Woe to them that are at ease in Zion, . . ." (Amos 6:1). We feel that things must be done our way or not at all. (And "not at all" is about as far as some of us have got.) Note with me the prophet Jonah was very much upset when the people of Ninevah repented at his preaching. It made Jonah's preaching appear to be mistaken doom. He seemed disappointed when men repented and did not go to ruin instead. A turning to God today would make some Jonah's peeevish, for their programs did not anticipate an upset. Beware of getting wrought up over the gourd, more interested in sitting in the shade than rejoising over the

salvation of souls. We are living in the last days of time and we must face the challenge of the world, with the Gospel message and a building program that will win the lost to Christ. It is one thing to say that we have a burden for the lost and dying, and that we are praying the Lord to save the lost. But, good friend, there is a great need for us in our day to get out from under the gourd vine of our comforts and ideas about what should be done and get to work for the Lord.

Like Jonah, many of us know what the Lord wants us to do, and what he wants us to say. But we are at ease in the comforts of our homes and churches with no vision of the church that is in need of help from the Lord, and the need of the lost without Christ. Jonah was so at ease under his gourd vine that he got mad at God when he allowed the worm to cut it down. Jonah was so full of stubborness that he was so displeased even with God when God did not destroy Nineveh. Stubborness breaks more hearts, wrecks more homes, divides more churches, fills more hospital beds and suicide graves than any other form of iniquity, for the root of most trouble is an unbroken self.


God said to Jonah, "Thou hast had pity on the gourd, . . . and should not I spare Ninevah, that great city? . . ." (Jonah 4:10-11). May we turn to God with all of our hearts as a Movement of people with a vision of the need of the world. "Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields: for they are white already to harvest" (John 4:35). "Therefore said he unto them, The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest" (Luke 10:2)-

Brother, Sister, let us not sit in the shade of the gourd vine any longer, but let us arise and go forth with the message that will save the world as Jonah's preaching moved the hearts of the people of Nineveh. So many today, say, "Be careful that we do not drift into a form or a program like others." May we say to you that feel that way, "Unless you get busy for the Lord you have already drifted into a stand-still program." (So many of us are so afraid that we will get out on a limb that we never get up the tree.) It is high time to awake out of sleep and stir up the gift of God that is within us. It has been said that we are no longer "spiritual," but "glorified critics," inwardly sizing up what we hear, putting truth into mental cubbyholes. Jonah did just that when he complained to God about cutting the gourd vine down. He should have been happy with the message that God had given him to preach and the souls that turned to God. But instead he was upset. Why? Because it was not done like he wanted it to be done. Some of us had rather suffer ruin than not to have our way about how things should be done. We get under the gourd vine and there we sit full of the Spirit of God? Not at all, . . . the spirit of the Devil! The man that lives just for himself is engaged in a very small business. God so loved the world that He gave His only Son that the world might be saved.

Let us give of our service that others may live and enjoy the blessings of the Lord. All that the Lord is asking of each of us is just a reasonable service. But let us be sure that we render the service that will be pleasing to the Lord and not to ourselves. We have too many preachers who are at ease under their cwn gourd vine and do not know the struggles of trying to reach the lost with the Gospel message or the need of a church building program. May we awaken to the need and the vision of the work of the Lord. Where there is no vision, the people perish. Pro. 29:18. Unless we use our acquired spirititual energy in working for God, we develop a condition of spiritual stagnation that will poison the body and the result is a poor spiritual life. The things that once made us leap in the aisles now puts us to sleep in the pews. Remember our Text, "SAINTS OF THE GOURD VINE."



The Work of the Apostolic Faith Bible School By THE EDITOR

The Second of three articles As we go to press with the February issue of the Apostolic Faith Report, the Bible School is going into its second month of classes. The writer and his wife had the privilege to attend the classes, as guests, a few days ago. We were favorably impressed. The superintendent and the teachers informed us that the students were earnest and studious. We enjoyed the classes and the fellowship as well as the fine hospitality.

This month we will tell you a little of three consecrated couples that are freely giving their time, talent and energy to the Lord's work in the Bible School.

Brother and Sister Joe B. Dewees have spent thirty-eight years in the Lord's work. They have reared a fine Christian family. Bro. Dewees preached his first sermon on Thanksgiving day in 1925. Since that time he has served as Evangelist, Pastor, Teacher and Church Builder. The Dewees home is in Hempstead, Texas where they served as pastor many years. Bro. and Sis. Dewees found the Lord in the ministry of the Late Bro. S. W. Ditto and were also associated with the Late Charles F. Parham

Brother Dewees teaches a very important subject, Evangelism. In the study of Evangelism the importance of spreading the gospel and effect methods are studied. The many facets and branches and problems of the Gospel Work are discussed. The Bible is studied earnestly in view of Burden, Compassion, Calling, Preperation, The Power of anointing, and a real love for God and Humanity.

Sister Dewees was a school teacher before and after her marriage. She is capable to teach the classes in English that the students need. A practical approach to English problems are used. Sister Dewees is serving the Bible School in more than one capacity. She fills in as teacher in History and Study-Hall. She also assists the other ladies in their duties as Hostesses and preperation of meals. Brother and Sister Dewees have served in Bible School in previous years.

Brother and Sister Lowell Long are young in the Gospel as well as age. He is 28 and she is 23. They are dedicated to the Lord's work. They were converted in August of 1954. Bro. Long felt the call to preach in 1956. They attended the Bible School as students for two years. Now they are returned to serve on the faculty. Bro. Long keeps the Study-Hall. When the students are not in class they are in the study hall. It is his duty to keep order as well as helping the students with their study problems. Bro. Long is also Dean of Boys. The Boys dormitory joins the Dean's apartment. The dean is a friend and counsellor of the boys. The dean oversees the chores and menial task; that are assigned to the male students, such as repair work, janitor work etc.

Sister Long keeps the nursery. This is very important. Some of the Bible Students have children that need care during the time the students are in class. Sister Long maintains the nursery that is designed for this purpose. In the past many mothers have attended classes because the nursery was available.

Brother and Sister Harold J. Bollinger have been associated with the Bible School for a long time. Harold attended the school as student for two years and Willburta attended as student for three years. This is Bro. Harold's fifth year as teacher. Sister Bollinger served as cook for two years and this is her second year as teacher. This consecrated young couple have served the Lord from early youth. They are only twenty-five years old. Bro. Harold has been preaching for nine years. He held his first Revival in a new field near Doniphan, Missouri before he was out of high school. Bro.



Bro. Bollinger serves in the music field in the Bible School. He gives private lessons on piano. He also conducts a class in Choral music. Gospel Workers every where are aware of the dire need for a working knowledge in Music. The classes in Choral as well as Piano are very important to help our workers to be able to direct choirs and play instruments for sacred services in our churches and revivals. No charge is made for these music lessons. These teachers as well as others are working for God and trust the Lord to provide their daily needs.

Sister Bollinger serves as teacher she teaches two classes.

These are Sunday School Training and Child and Youth Evangelism. The practical Sunday School needs are studied in this Sunday School Training class. The need is very great in this field. All christian workers have long felt the need of trained Sunday School teachers. This need is met in this class. If more of our folk could feel this need and attend the School and these classes, our Sunday School problems would be better solved.

In Child and Youth Evangelism, Sister Bollinger teaches the better techniques in working with Children and Young People in special services.

тне CHARACTERISTICS OF SIN By Jack Cornell

Romans 5:21, "That as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord". There are many powers in the world today. When we enumerate them in our thoughts we embrace many things concerning "Power". We think of the great implements, with power to fall a tree or move a mountain. We think also of many powers in the world both past and present, which men have ubilt that have become "Power-houses." When one visits places such as our great "Boulder Dam" he learns of the great amount of electric power that is sent from that one place to the many outlying cities.

These are things that man has built with his hands, these are some "Powers" that we find on the field of human activity. But I want to mention the "Power of the Devil, the Power of Sin". Our scripture text tells us that sin has reigned unto death. Then it tells of a greater power, "The grace of God reigneth, even unto everlasting life". Today too many people think the power of sin is too great to be defeated, but the Power of Grace is greater than the Power of Sin.

Let us look at the characteristics of sin and see what it is doing, has done, and will do as long as man allows it to have control. Turn to Proverbs 14:34, **"Righteousness exalt**eth a Nation, but sin is a reproach to any people". Sin is a reproach but righteousness exalts a nation, how true, but every man that knows the worth of prayer, every one that lives for the Lord, he has found that when surrendered to God in righteousness, he becomes lifted up by the Lord.

Sin brings dishonor to nations, families, and individuals. It always has and always will until Jesus comes back to bring true everlasting Peace and everlasting Joy to the world. The devil has put a false face upon sin to make it look beautiful and attractive to the eye until it has deceived many a person. It has crept into the lives of many people, unknown to them because they were deceived.

Hebrews 3:13, "But exhort one another daily, while it is called Today; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin". Sin is deceitful. It lies in wait to slip upon its prey and deceive that person until they do not know what is happening to them. The devil is smart, he knows his business, and works in ways we cannot comprehend.

Like leprosy, sin starts in a small way. People first begin to dabble and play with sin. That is exactly what the devil wants us to do, just to play along until finally we have our hand in so far the trap will spring, then we're caught. When that happens there is only one remedy, to go to the Lord, to ask Him for help. Let us guard against the enemy and not allow him to enter with sin. If we will live close enough to the Lord, He will protect us from the Power of the enemy. God built a hedge around Job because of his faithfulness. Could we not have a hedge built about us if God found favor in our life as a Christian?

Sin, at first appears harmless, until men have partaken of that thing, and as the scripture tells us, it hardens their heart. Through the edceitfulness of sin, many a man, woman, boy or girl have slipped from this stage of action, lost and doomed for destruction. It is our duty, Christian, to warn people of the characteristics of sin.

We have found it is a reproach and it is deceitful. Then we find in Matthew the 24th chapter, verse ten that sin betrays, "And then shall many be offended, and shall betray one another, and shall hate one another". Sin has betrayed that heart and has caused men to hate one another and to leave the Love we once had from God. Sin has betrayed many and they have lost their first love. He told one church in Revelation 2:4. "Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love". Have we slipped into the rut we once warked in? A little of the fire has burned out, the lamp needs to be refired, because we have been betrayed. One of the betrayals has been that of "Formalism" which has slipped into many of our churches in the Full Gospel Ranks. It is a constant fight, an every-day battle to fight against these powers of Satan.

If we fail in our Bible-Study, if we let up in our Prayer-Life, the fire has begun to burn low. If the desire to attend church slips away from us and we make excuses, we are being betrayed. Let us awaken to our responsibilities to resist sin.


Many who were once a power for God, have allowed sin to come in and be a reproach to their life. That standard they once held, they hold no longer. Could it be they have been betrayed by sin? Could it be they have been deceived? We must guard against this. Many homes are torn apart by sin. Those parents who once had time to take their small children around them and teach them the Word of God, now have no time for that. Instead, they are running to and fro, building only for this life as far as possessions are concerned. Our treasures hsould be laid up in heaven.

Not only in the homes but even since the beginning of time, sin has betrayed some in the churches. Ananias and Sapphira were deceived in this way. Every Christian should desire to build for eternity, and fight against these evils.

We turn again to our text, "That as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord". How do you stand? How do you live? Are you living for the Lord or do you need to go back and regain the "first Love".

We can fight Sin. We can have the victory over sin. This can be done only throught the Power of Jesus Christ.

They were beaten, stoned to death, placed in prison with their feet fast in the stocks and various other afflictions and persecutions, but they loved not their lives even unto death, and rejoiced in that they were counted worthy to suffer for Jesus.

Charity suffereth long and is kind. 1 Cor. 13:4. Why did they have to suffer at the hands of cruel men? Because of declaring God's word. Crying aloud against sin. In Galatians the fifth chapter we read, "Now the works of the flesh are manifest which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, idolatry, witchcraft, drunkenness, revelling and such like. They which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God."

Through faith the sick were healed and devils cast out. How could they say, "Father hold not this sin to their charge"? How could they pray and sing praises unto God in prison? The answer: Through God's amazing grace! It had brought them salvation.
