Only certain items - building construction, furniture and fixtures, textbooks, equipment, technology - can be funded with bond dollars. The passage of bond elections is the best way for Jenks Public Schools to make district-wide capital improvements. Schools cannot use bond funds to pay for salaries, hire additional staff, or cover operational expenses.

### Will this bond issue increase taxes?

No! Due to the fact that previous district bond issues will be taken off the tax roll and the district's assessed value has continued to grow over the past year, Jenks patrons can expect NO INCREASE in Jenks school taxes as a result of passing the 2016 bond issue package.

## Does my vote really matter?

Yes! Every single vote is extremely important in a bond election because state law requires a 60% super majority for passage of the bond. By voting, you are allowing your voice to be heard and one single vote could mean the difference in approving critical funds for Jenks Public Schools. Please cast your vote on February 9th!
