BCAH Starts a Youth Advisory Board

Youth Advisory Boards bring new ideas and energy to nonprofit organizations, which are benefits to having boards ran by youth volunteers. These students provide feedback that explores whether the programs being delivered by the organization serve the interests of the younger segment of the community. This is especially important for organizations, like BCAH, that seek to present programs that appeal to every age group.



Last quarter, the BCAH Board decided it was time to incorporate the youth perspective into its programs and future directions. BCAH's new Youth Advisory Board met for the first time in January. It's being led by Heart of Broomfield Youth Award winner and committed volunteer, Daniel Riffin. Daniel took the initiative of starting the group by recruiting students who are interested in volunteerism and arts and culture.

The trio brought fresh ideas to the table, which included social media campaigns to be run by the group and creating a Slam Poetry and RAP (Rhythm and Poetry) event. Carolyn Crouse, the BCAH board member who will serve as the Youth Advisory Board's liaison, and Keri Dillingham, BCAH's Executive Director, worked with the students on formulating their ideas and began the early stages of developing short-term and long-term goals for the group. BCAH is excited to see how this Youth Advisory Board will connect BCAH to the community's youth in the coming months!

Do you know a high school or middle school student who would like to make a difference in their community? BCAH's Youth Advisory Board would love to have their participation! Meetings will be held at 7 p.m. on the 4th Thursday of the month in February and April. March's meeting will be held on the 3rd Thursday due to Spring Break. 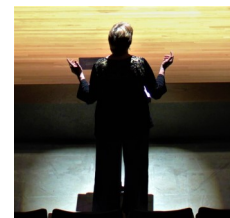
Where would composers and singers be without poets? During National Poetry Month, ASTER salutes poetry with a concert of musical settings of works by familiar poets including Emily Dickinson and E. E. Cummings, along with poems which were written by Jane, Cassandra and Mrs. George Austen when they were playing a parlour game which was popular during their lifetime. The concert also includes settings of E. Pauline Johnson's poem about a lullaby which bird's sing, a poetic text written by a women's choir, and a poem by Christa Dickason about a sea lion's personal ad seeking love.

ASTER is delighted to welcome Chamber Ensemble con Grazia (CEG) as our special guests. Grace Asquith, director of CEG, has a long association with the choir, both as a pianist and as a composer. CEG will perform the following pieces, which have special Colorado connections:

Long Division (2018), premiered by Christina Lynn-Craig and Grace Asquith, was inspired by the words of Loveland, Colorado poet, Caroline Orman. With descriptive detail of the angst and consequences of missing an important day of instruction in elementary school, Caroline's poetic genius touches the readers/listeners in their own personal tender spots. The alternating characters heard in the sung portions and the recitatives highlight the often unspoken dialogues in our minds.



My Mother Talks of Clouds (2019), commissioned by CEG, received an enthusiastic audience response at its premiere on September 6, 2019. Evoking the expanse of the open prairies of North Dakota and the harsh, lonely life for a young girl nearly a century ago, the colors of the bass flute and harp support the descriptive poetry in the vocal line. Local composer John Fuerst and his poet sister, Catherine Fuerst, have created numerous magical moments in their ongoing collaborations. The choir has fallen in love with these pieces and we think that our audience members will, too!

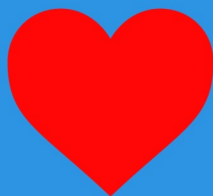




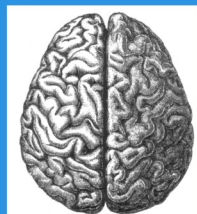

Sustainable Broomfield

Sustainable Broomfield is a citizen-led group that would like to see more sustainable initiative in our local community. We aim to achieve this by providing residents with advocacy opportunities, easy access to resources, and educational information and events.

Our group formed in February 2019 with an initial goal to get curbside composting available to all Broomfield residents. That project has now been taken on by the city's Environmental Stewardship Advisory Task Force and they have plans to take major steps to work towards that goal in 2020. To make an immediate difference, Sustainable Broomfield started teaching residents how to compost in their own backyards. We held composting information booths at The Sustainability Expo, Oracle's Earth Day Celebration, Broomfield Farmer's Market, and Broomfield Days, as well as teaching our own backyard composting classes.



Sustainable Broomfield began meeting monthly and inviting guest speakers to present topics beyond composting. We learned about urban farming, vermicomposting, the climate crisis, and "how to quit plastics." Our group asked sustainability questions of the City Council candidates and was honored to have the City Manager, Jennifer Hoffman, speak with our group. We expect 2020 to be an even bigger year for Sustainable Broomfield.

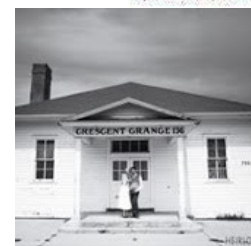
