## **Accolades**

■ Superintendent **Dr. Diana** Greene of Manatee County Public Schools is this year's "Outstanding Superintendent Communicator," an honor given by the Sunshine State School

Public Relations Association (SUNSPRA). Dr. Greene accepted the award in Tampa at the 72nd Annual Joint Conference of the Florida School Boards Association.

Greene launched and supports two major communication initiatives - the "ManaTeach" video series and #WeManatee social media campaign — to build trust and overcome false impressions. She led the information campaign resulting in voters renewing a half penny sales tax school district capital needs in 2016 that passed with 59 percent in favor. And now, she's on a quest to convince voters to approve a one-mill increase in property taxes in March for district operational needs including improving teacher salaries and lengthening the school day by half-an-hour.

Dr. Greene's success so far has even convinced her school board to extend her contract three years into the future. Dr. Diana Greene has led the School District of Manatee County since 2015.

A committee of judges Accredited in Public Relations (APR) and Certified Public Relations Counselors (CPRC) scored this year's entries. Judges included Allison Campbell (A&A Campbell Group), Toni James (Toni James & Associates), and Ginger Broslat (Ginger Broslat Communications).

■ Ava Ehde, Manatee County's Library Services Manager since 2011, has been named interim director of Manatee County Neighborhood Services Department. The department includes Probation,

Under Ehde's leadership, Manatee Libraries has expanded its educational and technological resources and programs at its six locations, with over 1.9 million

> customers annually using resources. Library usage has soared 85 percent in 10 years. Ongoing technological training and computer assistance continue to reach residents, and more than 62,000 patrons attended informational and educational programs this year. Also during Ehde's tenure as manager of the library system, Manatee County won the Florida Library Association's 2013 Library Innovation Award and the 2016 Library of the Year. Ehde received the association's Libra-
