For thousands of years, Indigenous people have walked in this land. As we gather for worship this morning, we acknowledge that we are gathered in the traditional territory of the Nehiyawê (Cree), Nahkawê (Saulteaux), Lakota, Dakota, and Nakota First Nations and the homeland of the Michif/Metis Nation, now defined as Treaty 4, and we acknowledge their stewardship of this land throughout the ages. We recognize this statement in itself is not reconciliation work - this stand-alone acknowledgment must be accompanied by multiple acts that continue to deepen our understanding of the connections between Indigenous peoples and the lands on which we are joined through the course of history and through treaty signing.

**IMPORTANT FINANCIAL UPDATE:** <u>Click here</u> to view the most recent financial update for the quarter ending in November. November was pretty much a break even month for Eastside, leaving an operating deficit of \$12,658 for the year to date (see attached). December is shaping up well, with a donation of approximately \$2,100 that will be forthcoming, so a small surplus is anticipated for the month. Also, Eastside's share of the mortgage will be less than \$9,000 by December 31, 2022 after deducting cash amounts that have been set aside for this purpose. The mortgage will be retired at August 31, 2024. A rough 2023 Budget reveals potential for a deficit of \$20,000-25,000 for 2023 at current revenue levels. In other words, local giving is expected to be \$150,000-155,000 for 2022, but would need to be roughly \$175,000 in 2023 to break even. In the absence of a significant revenue increase in 2023, Eastside's cash position would be very low by the end of 2023 (\$0-10,000), after having had a balance of \$54,227 at the end of 2021. To put this in context, in 2021, Eastside had only 80 families that gave more than \$100 for the year, so the burden for each family will be substantial in 2023. In 2024, costs will likely exceed \$180,000 due to the minster's sabbatical, residual mortgage costs and ongoing inflationary pressures. The Leadership Team approved a sabbatical for Russell, Dec 11 2023-March 11, 2024.
