don't always get what we want. These words should resound in the ears of my children all the days of their lives. I said it enough to them. There are things we need to know about this life that will help us accept the gospel and our own condition in life. I know I get frustrated with what goes on with me, the world, really anything around me. Some people get depressed at their condition, some get angry, we all need to learn how to exercise temperance and direct our actions to be a good Christian example. The title of the lesson this morning is "Life is not fair, but it is good." I hope we can learn a lot from the Scirptures presented.

The Hatton Half: The Gospel in John 3:16

The gospel, as we know, is the power God chose to employ in saving man from sin (Rom. 1:16). Contained within the gospel itself is the good news of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus from the dead (1 Cor. 15:1-4). Included within that message is a ray of hope shining through what one may judge to be a dark time (Eph. 1:10). If one was to ask random individuals off the street what a popular verse is, the responses may be broad-reaching. One of the more popular verses may be John 3:16. Let us now embark on a journey to find the gospel within John 3:16.

The first element at which we arrive is God. As we know, God has been around since before this world was conceived. God was around when the earth was "without form and void" (Gen. 1:2). Did this in any way affect Him? No, for God is not affected by things of the physical world. It was the writer of Revelation who boldly made known that Jesus, who is God, possesses the same attribute (Rev. 1:8, 11). In discussing God, we know that God did something that none of us could ever do for ourselves. It was this response that showed us how we are to love all men (1 John 4:7-8).

The second element for consideration is "that he gave his only begotten son." We could never have been the sacrificial lamb, for many in days before the cross were separated from God because of their sins (Isa. 59:1-2). In readiness for this situation, God planned to send down the Second member of the Godhead to take upon Himself flesh and be the One to take away the sins of the world (John 1:14, 29). God truly demonstrated His love in allowing the Christ to die (Rom. 5:6-8). When God does something like this, He does it with affirmative action, as we should demonstrate our love (John 14:15). In so doing, we show ourselves to be friends of God.
