A Few Thoughts from Sister Lisa:

What's on your radar?

In the last two reflections, my intention was to console and strengthen each of you in some way, and to ultimately point the way to God in the midst of our busy lives. This time, I hope to challenge you. I composed this introductory statement while I was on retreat this weekend. I was going to talk about forgiveness, that challenging and freeing gift God gives us. I had it all planned. Then last night one of "my ladies" passed away, and my message has changed.

Gloria was a 97 year old South Philly Italian lady and a spitfire to the end. She once said to me, "you have a good heart and God sent you to take care of miserable old women like me." When I first entered the convent, I dreamed of working with young people, then I dreamed of teaching in the ghetto. Those dreams came true and then my dreaming shifted. Helping "miserable old women" and prior to that, being an administrator at our college were not on my radar, but following God's will for me, God's dream for me was on my radar.

What has God sent you to do? We all take care of someone, miserable or not...and God gives us all we need to do so. During Lent, we often focus on bettering ourselves. We give up excesses or try to go to church more or be more charitable. I'm trying to drive to work with more patience! Most of us forget it's Lent, especially on Friday when that McDonald's breakfast sandwich is in hand. God doesn't forget and He gives us this season to come closer to Him. Like a father or mother, or grandmother, God just wants us to be near. God wants to be on our radar!

So, my Hibernian sisters, I leave you with this: YOU have a good heart, and God has sent you to (fill in the blank). God's dream for you is alive. Spend the rest of this sacred time of Lent drawing near to our Lord, and during Holy Week spend extra time with Him. Easter is the highlight of our faith life. Jesus really did rise from the dead, and by doing so, conquered sin and death. So rejoice and keep God on your radar!
