If there are more than 25%, they are put on a list of Potential Life Members. Life Members are entitled to all of the privileges of the Club. Our Vice-President, Sandra Ojeda Medina, has a special program planned to honor our Past Presidents and a special emcee has been invited to interview our honorees. I wonder what we may learn on October 5th!


## Member News
