Per Code of Ordinance 5.500 (b) (3) A written plan and detailed description of requested outdoor burn must be submitted with permit application.

CONDITIONS OF PERMIT

1. All outdoor burns require a City permit.
2. The initiation of burning shall commence no earlier than one hour after sunrise.
3. Permitted outdoor burning must be attended by a responsible adult at all times and until the fire is extinguished.
4. Burning shall not be commenced when surface wind speed is less than 5 mph or greater than 20 mph during the burn period. All area weather conditions are to be determined by the National Weather Service Forecast Office online at www.weather.gov.
5. Burning shall not be conducted during periods of persistent low-level atmospheric temperature inversions.
6. The location for open burning shall not be less than 50 feet from any structure.
7. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher with a minimum 4-A rating or other approved on site extinguishment equipment such as a garden hose, water truck or heavy equipment must be on site and available for immediate utilization during the entire period of open burning.
8. Electrical insulation, treated lumber, plastics, non-wood construction/demolition materials, heavy oils, asphalt materials, potentially explosive materials, chemical wastes, and items containing natural or synthetic rubber shall not be burned.
9. The fire must not include materials hauled from another property.
10. The authority to conduct outdoor burning under this permit does not exempt or excuse any person responsible from the consequences, damage, or injuries resulting from the burning and does not exempt or excuse anyone from complying with all other governmental entities having jurisdiction, even though the burning is otherwise conducted in compliance with this regulation.
11. Where it is determined by the fire marshal that the fire department's presence is required at the scene, additional fees will apply. (Code of Ordinance 5.500 (c))
12. The responsible party must notify the Teague Police Department, City of Teague Fire Marshal and the Freestone County Sheriffs Department of date and time of permitted outdoor burn.
13. Per Code of Ordinance 5.500 (c) all outdoor burn applications and plans are subject to the review, modifications, and consideration for approval by the City of Teague's Fire Marshal.
