Pastoral Supply Update

Trinity's Congregation Council is pleased to tell you that Pastor Dan Shutters, who has been with us in November and December, will continue to assist us for the forseeable future. As a reminder, Rev. Shutters was ordained in 1969 after graduating with a Master of Divinity degree from Waterloo Lutheran Seminary, Waterloo, Ontario. He is a pastor with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Americ.a.

Pastor Shutters has been delivering messages for children for most of his ministry. He has a unique way of communicating with children, as a member of the Society of American Magicians. He has performed stories from his book, *"Magic in Ministry.* In the early days of home computers he wrote *Farway* as an educational program for Lutheran World Relief, which illustrated the problems encountered by bringing wells to African villages. In 1979, the Red Cross asked him to help children in the Hershey, PA shelter, set up during the accident at nearby Three Mile Island. Another book authored by Rev. Shutters, is *The Mouse with the Broken Tail*, a parable of the Book of Exodus for use as a series of children's sermons. Take advantage of the opportunity to hear God's message in a different pastoral style.

An Excerpt from Pastor Dan Shutters' Sermon at Trinity, November 4, 2018

Excerpted and Adapted with Permission

This story is about a widow.

She came to the temple to put in her offering. In those days, offerings weren't anonymous. There were 13 jars along the wall. They were made of metal and each container was designated for a different use--buying wood for the burnt offerings, the purchase of incense, and so on.

You gave your money to the priest on duty and stated which one of the 13 different purposes you had decided on. The priest announced the amount of the offering and placed it in the appropriate jar. This widow literally had just put in her two cents worth. It was all she had. We don't know for which purpose she intended her offering to go, what led to her poverty, or what she expected to happen later. She could have been a beggar, or the victim of some financial fiasco. She was a widow--a woman, with no source of income. All that we have is the text, and there is no context for the passage to rest in. But because it was everything she had, Jesus commended her. In return, Jesus didn't promise untold riches, an endless feast, or untold power. Or even that she would have enough flour and oil to last until the rains came.

In talking about her, he simply said, in so many words, she didn't give a donation, what she gave was a sacrifice.

We live in a country where free enterprise is encouraged. Everybody wants something. And there is always someone waiting to fulfill our wants. If you WANT it, you NEED it. And, if you need it, then you deserve it. 'So for only 50 cents on the dollar', says the commercial, 'we are going to GIVE you, the product you DESERVE to ease your tension

That is, however, not the logic that Jesus has. What the Christ says in the words and actions of his whole life is condensed into two sentences. 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and love your neighbor as yourself.' And the second, 'No one has a greater love than they sacrifice their life for another.' That is precisely what Christ was doing for us on the cross. Laying down his life, sacrificing for each of us.

You have been given the opportunity to pledge financial support for this congregation and its ministries. Whether you chose to pledge or not will affect your congregation. It will affect whether you are able to choose to call a pastor with some experience or one newly out of seminary.

The benevolence line in the budget will affect how the church at large, the synod and the national church, are able to support missionaries and mission churches, not only church camps, and seminaries, but also congregations in poverty stricken areas. (There are 26 Lutheran spots in Puerto Rico.) A portion of it goes to add to the pensions of pastors who during their ministries were underpaid. "

If you don't meet Trinity's needs, "there is no promise of untold riches, an endless feast, or enormous power or even that you will have enough oil and flour to last until the rains come."

Please take time to attend the Budget Forum and Trinity Resource Update, scheduled for your convenience on Sundays, January 13 and 20, 9:15 a.m. and 10:45 p.m. and the Annual Congregation Meeting on Sunday, January 29, 9:15 a.m. between services, to learn how you can further the goals of Trinity for 2019. Invest a little of your time and talents; you and Trinity will benefit.

Thoughts from a Senior Shut-in

In October, a letter to shut-ins mentioned that our Council was asking members for ideas for programs that might be of interest to new members (and old, and youth). One reader responded that she had no program ideas but she felt her daily devotion had provided a good direction. She quoted from *Christ in Our Home*:

"So often we resist letting God carry us along with love and grace; we try to rely on our own strength. Jesus often asked for a small act of obedience. 'Pick up your bed and walk' or 'Feed the people'. He showed the people what they could do because of their faith and trust in Him. Living in faith means trusting God to lead. God does lead, yet we sometimes insist on relying on our understanding. Sometimes it's only when we are depleted from our own efforts that we learn to work with God."

The shut-in concluded "Just faith in God sounds so easy, but I believe it is something to think about." Words of wisdom for sure. Thank you for sharing with us your thoughts and faith.
