Campbell County, Natrona County, and Fremont County Sheriffs and their staff traveled to Pierre, SD, for a review of their established program. Campbell and Natrona County are moving forward with the program and are targeting mid to the end of summer 2017 to have their programs active.</p>

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<b>DISCUSSION</b>	Joey talked about SADD’s work in the schools and her youth involvement. Initiatives and developing a youth leadership board and nationwide exposure for the Wyoming youth. College involvement is a goal for this program.
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<b>DISCUSSION</b>	Ernie provided an overview of the task force, membership, goals and mission.

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<b>DISCUSSION</b>	Compliance rate is about 30%. Ignition Interlock offers alternatives for probationary or limited driving privileges. Senator Kinskey will be offering two bills in the next Legislative Session to address issues with the Ignition Interlock and 24/7. Coordination between driver’s services, enforcement, and the judiciary. Lifetime Ignition Interlock required drivers (6) are petitioning to have the Ignition Interlock requirement removed from their license.
