While we sprint through Advent, running as fast as we can through the season to get to the end, the people of Israel were on edge. "How much longer?" and "When will this wait end?" would be the questions on their



minds. For them, the birth of Jesus was a relief, and the waiting was over. Jesus was among them.

For many people on this planet, Christmastime is the sprint through the errands and events leading up to Christmas Day. Yet, like Israel, they are waiting for something to happen. Missions Update | Russ Douglass & Mary Hopkins

rinity Church supports several missionaries. We will focus on Russ Douglass and Mary Hopkins this month.

Russ Douglass serves in northeast San Diego County with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA). FCA provides numerous activities and events revolving around sports for middle and high school students. Russ and his team organized 40 continuing Huddles (Bible studies) and started five new ones throughout North County this fall. This year, new leaders stretched their wings, learning to be comfortable in front of their peers.

Beginning in 2021, FCA ran FCA Sports Leagues in Valley Center, partnering with Valley Center Community Church. The participants learn various sports, how to play effectively, and share the Gospel, giving the students a firm biblical foundation for faith in Jesus.

Mary Hopkins works with Wycliffe. She sent out a fall newsletter. I have pulled a few of the highlights for this article. She shared a couple of exciting items about the translation work Wycliffe is doing.

- As of July 2024, Wycliffe translators begin a new Bible translation project every 15 hours on average. In 2019, the average was a new project every 120 hours, a significant increase in projects started.
- As of September 1, 2024, only 985 languages need Bible translation for the first time. In

addition, we have fallen below 1,000 languages left for the first time ever!

Many of these languages without any Bible are sign languages. Deaf people use many of these sign languages in countries hostile to the gospel. With the development of a program called Chameleon, Wycliffe no longer needs an identifiable person to do the signing, keeping human signers safe.

Another technological development that helps in the translation of languages is artificial intelligence (Al). This technology helps to translate the Old Testament into a language that already has the New Testament. The Al technology translates a rough draft of an Old Testament book using the existing New Testament translation. The translator can then revise and edit the rough draft where necessary. This method saves time translating the Old Testament.

On a personal note, Mary woke up one morning in early November to a flooded house. A connector pipe behind the refrigerator had popped off, releasing water at high pressure. Thankfully, everything got cleaned up and fixed in a timely manner! Mary praises God that she did not need to move out, but what a mess!
