Dear St Pius and St Anthony Churches, FROM THE Dear St Pius and St Anthony Churches, FROM THE Automation of the Sunday Ordinary Year C Lk 6:17, 20-26

The Beatitudes! Who can understand them? Does it make sense that the poor, sorrowful, hungry and persecuted are blessed? Blessed? It surely doesn't seem like a blessing? Yet, I love the detail that Luke includes to bring the blessing to such otherwise difficult conditions. Luke says here about Jesus, that he "raised his eyes toward His disciples" (Luke 6:20). There are two parts to that statement "1)Raising his eyes" and "toward 2)His disciples". What could possibly make those depriving conditions of hardship, like being poor, sad, hungry or picked on, what could make them blessings? First, we must 'look up-raise our sights' and know whose presence will make them blessed-Jesus Himself in it! Jesus 'raised' His eyes, to indicate that if we only consider earthbound-worldly values, then all seems lost when we suffer these conditions of poverty, sadness, hunger or persecution. BUT, if we look up and beyond this present moment, then good and glory are ahead (the better and beatitude are coming)! And secondly, even when we feel denied or deprived of something we think we need, AS long as we know we are WITH the people that matter most, then God will bring us through whatever deprivation we are experiencing. We will make it through just fine, WITH them. Jesus brings the blessing to these conditions. The Beatitudes make me think of how many people say about their childhoods, "We were all poor growing up, but didn't know it because we all had each other!" They have what matters! Or, I think of husbands and wives who tell each other, "Yeah, I would have liked that new, bigger home or that promotion overseas, but I would rather have you without it, than have it without you!" So, the Beatitudes challenge us to look beyond only what we see, and to peer into the deeper things above our everyday concerns. Stuff we possess or not, is important, but it is not all there is! Colossians 3:2 tells us to "Think of what is above, not of what is just on earth." And keep in mind WHO is with us: Jesus. With or without anything else, okay. But I must ensure that I am WITH Christ. He will make everything else okay.

Another insight or approach to understanding the Beatitudes comes from the popular proverb, 'Absence makes the heart grow fonder'. This is basically a spiritual principle behind 'fasting' or any voluntary penance. When we sacrifice, 'offer up' or deny ourselves anything for the service and glory of God, a blessing comes to us even in the 'giving away' of the initial good for greater good to come. Especially, when I know the value of what I am giving to someone else, the blessing increases even more. What is good to me from God, if offered to another person for their good too, is even better! (See the multiplication!) And I appreciate the gift's value all the more, if, it or its kind ever returns to me. For example, when I have done without something for a while, I know the sweetness of it all the more when it returns to me! I also treasure it again unlike ever before, on its return. This is wisdom: knowing what one truly has-blessing! This grateful approach to life in all of its ups and downs is at the core of the Beatitudes. This wisdom is reflected in (Is it Winnie the Pooh?) the saying, "How lucky I am to have something or someone that makes saying goodbye to them so hard" or said another way, "Be Happy that you have had something to be Sad over!" Job captures this sense of Beatitude in the Old Testament, when he prayed, "The Lord gives and the Lord takes away, Blessed be the Name of the Lord" (Job 1:21). St Paul was on to it when he stated "In every circumstance and in all things I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry" (Philippians 4:12).

Or even one more insightful approach to understanding the Beatitudes can be taken if we reflect upon that lesson life teaches us that if we truly want to appreciate something in life, we have to take an active part in making it so. For example, if I have really put myself into something (a task, sport, art, work or person) then I really know what it means and what it is worth. People reveal this all the time when they say things like "don't just give it to them or they won't appreciate it". Or think of how often we've heard parents concerned not to spoil their child, saying, "I want my son to work for his car, so that he will be sure to take care of it!" Again, once we know the value of something, whether it is in my possession or not, I am better for it (have benefitted from it) and appreciate it whether near to me or far from me. God is its source, God gave it once, and God can give it again! Blessed be God's Name, and Blessed be anyone who lives in His Name! Peace, Fr Brian


