Chapter goal for the year - "Build Membership"!!



SAFETY - FALL PROTECTION (Taken from "Safety Puzzles for OSHA's Top Ten Violations)

What is Fall Protection?

Fall protection is a system that is designed to protect personnel from the risk of falls when working at elevated heights.

Fall prevention is a structural design that limits a fall to the same level. Some examples are platforms with guardrails, bucket trucks, or aerial lifts with work platforms.

Fall arrest equipment is designed to significantly limit injuries in the event of a fall. It is very important that the equipment be selected and worn correctly.

In the construction industry in the United States, falls are the leading cause of worker fatalities. Annually, 150 to 200 workers are killed, and more than 100,000 are injured as a result of falls at construction sites. Fall protection must be provided at:

- · 4 feet in general industry;
- · 5 feet in maritime; and
- · 6 feet in construction.

However, regardless of the fall distance, fall protection must be provided when working over dangerous equipment and machinery.


Any time a worker is at a height of six feet or more (construction industry) or four feet or more (general industry), the worker must be protected. Use at least one of the following precautions:

- Guardrail systems
- Safety net systems
- Fall arrest systems
- Cover or guard floor holes as soon as they are created
- Guard or cover any openings or holes immediately.
- Construct all floor hole covers so that they will effectively support two times the weight of employees, equipment, and materials that might be imposed on the cover at any one time.
- In general, it is better to use fall prevention systems, such as guardrails, than fall protection systems, such as safety nets or fall arrest devices.

Employers and employees need to do the following:

- Where protection is required, select fall protection systems appropriate for given situations.
- ✓ Use proper construction and installation of safety systems.
- ✓ Supervise employees properly.
- ✓ Use safe work procedures.
- ✓ Train workers in the proper selection, use, and maintenance of all protection systems.







Onie was born July 16, 1948 in Breckenridge, Minnesota. She attended school in Campbell, MN and North Dakota School of Science in Wahpeton, ND

Onie thoroughly enjoyed her work with Dakota Supply Group of Fargo as evidenced by her 41 years of service with the company. She was a member of the Fargo-Moorhead, ND Chapter #246 of the National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) since 1988.

She tried to attend regional meetings but wasn't always able to but since she was feeling better she joined Dawn Wiedewitsch and I on the long drive to attend Forum in Rapid City in 2013. Her first Forum had been in 1993 in the Black Hills and I had the great honor of presenting Onie with her 25 year NAWIC membership pin at the 2013 Forum.

Onie will definitely be missed as a friend, co-worker and NAWIC member.

My daughter, Carrie Bertsch Vetter (a past NAWIC Member) said it perfectly when she posted this on Facebook:

"Today the world lost one of the most amazing women in my life. Her strength and perseverance has inspired me to never give up hope. Through all her battles with cancer she never once gave up.
