- 6. Rosser: Are you doing anything different since meth was found in several libraries? HWhelan: We've held conversations with health professionals and we decided not to test. We've found no proof of drugs in our bathrooms. McKlem: We have not had any reports of such. We've enhanced our hazmat group to deal if there is a problem. Rosser: Do the librarians have any kind of training, what to be aware of? HWhelan: We do have training. We have security concierge team to build a relationships, to respond.
- E. City of Centennial, Email from Christine Sweetland, Council member Dist. 2
  - The Centennial Center Park expansion is complete and open. On 19 July, Centennial Center Park will host the District 3 Social and a ribbon cutting for the grand opening of the north expansion of the Park. But, the expansion is open so people can check it out before the ribbon cutting.
  - The YMCA Center for the Generations at the Streets of SouthGlenn had ribbon cutting and event was covered in both the Centennial Citizen and The Villager. I hope that everyone will stop by and see the programs that are offered and tell their communities. ### 4. Keynote Discussion

- County Commissioner Carrie Warren-Gully, District 1
- County Commissioner Jessica Campbell-Swanson, District 2 and
- The two tag-teamed their discussion.
  - The County is updating our oil & gas rules & regs, updates to fire code & sanitation. Public comment closes 6/29.

- Centennial Airport noise: From a collision recently, the FAA has made some tweeks, traffic is being pushed north of Arapahoe, between Havana & Dayton. (Andrea: Funny, that's where it was supposed to be.)
- Dove Valley Regional Park is undergoing major updates, preparing a championship field, lots of sun cover.
- There will be a split of 18<sup>th</sup> Judicial Dist., we must make sure funding is available.
   We're working with the DA. We already have some systems for bringing new employees on board.
- We're still in the <u>redistricting process</u>, since last Dec. You have until 11 July 11 to comment on the new map.
- The County has received \$127.5M of American Rescue Plan money towards helping vulnerable populations & homelessness. Money is dedicated to particular groups.
- The Public Health emergency (COVID) has ended. Anyone on federal assistance needs to be redetermined to qualify. Be very careful to whom you're giving your info. Be careful of preditors. Make sure you go to a government portal, .Gov designation.
- The Commissioners are considering how to stabilize the County's funding. We are one of only a few (2) counties not de-Bruced. We are postponing infrastructure needs and we're at the point where something has to change. We've been strategically using funds to stave off disaster but, we have a \$500M backlog of infrastructure projects.
- Public safety: protests put angst on the ACSO, demand on policing has increased.
   Surrounding munis are poaching ACSO officers.
- General operational services & abuse prevention, homelessness. ARPA money must be used by the end of 2024. Family support services, housing/food insecurity are increasing.
- We need to modernize the streams of revenue: only 13% of your property tax bill goes to County. We need to de-Bruce. The County doesn't send TABOR refund checks but, temporarily reduces the tax rate (15.81->12.2 mills)
- We briefly talked about the difficulties in housing.
- Questions were asked about what's happening with AUC 4 (commercial areas on the south side of Arapahoe Rd. at Yosemite), old strip malls updating, more awareness of development, ACSO Crime report.
- 6. Plans, Rhonda Livingston, Vice President: no plans
