THIS WEEK IN MARINE CORPS HISTORY

6 August 1847: Marines commenced their march on the "Halls of Montezuma" in Mexico.

"The **Halls of Montezuma**" refers to the Battle of Chapultepec on 12/13 September 1847 during the Mexican–American War, where a force of Marines stormed Chapultepec Castle. ... Legend has it that a Marine on duty in Mexico penned the hymn.

Marine Corps tradition maintains that the red stripe worn on the dress-blues trousers of officers and

noncommissioned officers, and commonly known as the blood stripe commemorates the high number of Marine NCOs and officers killed storming the castle of Chapultepec. (Source: Wikipedia)

One week later the Marine Corps announced the commitment of 45,000 troops to the Persian Gulf area as part of Operation Desert Shield which would become the largest deployment of U.S. forces since the Vietnam War.
