



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# PROGRAMS – FEBRUARY 2016 Housework Is For The Birds

Adapted from the book: Country Sunshine by Martie Halladay, 1995.

This design is from a 20 year old book so a lot of things have changed since then. Martie painted mainly in Ceramcoat paints, many of which are discontinued, and even has an old Accent Country Color listed in her pattern. For this adaptation, I have listed the colors Martie used (I'm sure I'm not the only one with 20 year old paint!) and with the colors I used in their place in brackets. CC is Ceramcoat, DA is DecoArt. There is quite a bit of basecoating on this piece so please do not wait until Valentines evening to start the prep. This prep info is wordy because I will not be around to answer any questions before the meeting and I want you to fully understand the prep.

### PREPPING FABRIC:

Begin the prep by washing your apron/fabric surface and dry WITHOUT any kind of softener. I know this sounds ridiculous but let the voice of experience tell you, if you skip this step it is almost certain that a good portion of your painting will disappear the first time you wash it! Iron if needed.

Mount your surface on **something rigid**. Maybe the piece of pink foam we've used for watercolor or one of the masonite boards that have clamps for displaying paper, a big piece of smooth cardboard, etc. I suggest if it's anything but the foam you wrap the board in a trash bag and tape in place.

Mount your fabric with tape or pins, stretching it taut to remove any wrinkles. I then put **butcher paper**, waxed side touching the backside of your pockets, inside the pockets so the paint doesn't "glue" your pockets to the apron.

### **PATTERN:**

Transfer your design using **Saral transfer paper**. Use online coupons to buy a variety pack of Saral at your nearest JoAnn's, in the notions department. I used red Saral and it blends well with the background colors we are using. Order **chicken wire stencil** from Laurie Speltz ASAP. And her stencil brushes are a dream if you need stencil brushes.

Center the HOUSEWORK banner towards the top of your apron, using the chicken wire stencil to help determine placement. (NOTE: chicken wire CAN be painted on with a liner brush. I will have a demo and/or a pattern for this in class.

Center the chickens and eggs over the pockets, leaving just a bit of area showing below the eggs for the chicken wire.

Transfer only the main elements, not the lettering or nostrils. You may leave the eyes open and base them with white as you basecoat the head or come back over painted heads and paint eyes after head has dried. In this case, retransfer eyes and nostrils after the heads and beaks have dried.

### STENCILING:

If you are planning on stenciling the chicken wire, I suggest you do the wire before

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is hard to cover up later. If you are going to paint in your wire, you can do it before or after painting the rest of the piece.

Remember to use Textile Medium with your paint anywhere your paint touches the fabric. Do not use water to thin your paint when you are painting on fabric. Use **Textile Medium** instead of water <u>always</u>. Mix textile medium, 1:1, with any paint that is going to touch the fabric. Later layers do not need the medium EXECPT to moisten your brush. Water makes the paint wick out into the fabric and you won't get clean margins.

You may make your chicken wire cover as much area as you choose. I chose the area from below the banner, around the chickens, ties and eggs, all the way to the bottom of the apron. You could also choose to cover the entire apron or even stencil the wire just here and there around the apron so it is just a suggestion of a coop. In that case you may want to move chickens above the pockets and do random wire on the pockets.

To figure out the outside edges of my wire I made an imaginary line between the left and right edges of the banner to the left and right edges of the hens and eggs. I stenciled that area opaquely and then faded out the value on the sides of the wire as I got further away from the center, fading out to nothing. There is a picture of this in the newsletter.

Wire is <u>Denim Blue CC # 02477</u>, (<u>Uniform Blue DA</u>). Don't forget the medium.

When stenciling, fully load your stencil brush, wipe off any excess paint and, beginning in the center, gently tap color in all of the openings. Because there is so much open work on this stencil, circular rubbing does not work well. Reload as needed, wipe the excess off of your brush and then begin again on an area you have already covered so your fresh paint doesn't seep through unpainted areas.

### **BASECOATING:**

You need to have the following elements basecoated before coming to class. If the surfaces are basecoated, I think we can finish it in class.

Base Heads Golden Brown CC #02054 (Honey Brown DA)

Base Combs Tangerine CC # 02043(Tangelo Orange DA)

Base Beaks Empire Gold CC # 02412(Marigold DA)

Base Eggs <u>Buttermilk DA (Light Mocha DA)</u>

Base Eyes White DA (Titanium White DA)

Ties may be based in any color you choose as long as you have a similar darker color to use for the darker designs that go on top of the basecoat.

Dioxazine Purple + White

Hauser Green Light

The same blue you are using for the chicken wire.

Base Banner Maple Sugar CC (Camel DA is almost identical)

**NOTE:** There are no bodies on these chickens. Crazy, I know, but Martie didn't design them with bodies. The chicken wire shows through all around the heads, eggs, and ties, including the area between the bottom of the apron and the eggs.

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**CLASS SUPPLIES:** Regular acrylic supplies PLUS:

Prep colors plus:

Custard CC #02448

Spice Brown CC #02049

Burnt Umber - any brand

Fire Red CC #02083

Black Cherry CC #02484

Pine Needle Green - No longer listed. Pick a green you like that is darker than the Hauser Green Light to decorate the tie.

Navy CC #02089

<u>Salem Blue</u> - No longer listed. Add white to your tie color or bring a lighter value blue you like.

**Brushes:** acrylic painting brushes but not really expensive brushes. Fabric is hard on brushes. You will probably want a medium size flat and/or angle and filbert and a good

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# Recipe Corner

### Oatmeal Chocolate Chip Peanut Butter Bars Recipe

TOTAL TIME: Prep: 15 min. Bake: 20 min. + cooling YIELD:36 servings

### Ingredients

1/2 cup butter, softened

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1/2 cup creamy peanut butter (I used Smuckers crunchy)

1 egg

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 cup all-purpose flour (I used 1/2 white & 1/2 whole wheat)

1/2 cup quick-cooking oats

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 cup (6 ounces) semisweet chocolate chips

### ICING:

1/2 cup confectioners' sugar

2 tablespoons creamy peanut butter

2 - 3 tablespoons milk

### **Directions**

- 1. In a large bowl, cream the butter, sugars and peanut butter until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and vanilla. Combine the flour, oats, baking soda and salt; gradually beat into creamed mixture and mix well. Spread into a greased 13-in. x 9-in. baking pan. Sprinkle with chocolate chips.
- 2. Bake at 350° for 20-25 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool on a wire rack for 10 minutes.
- 3. Combine icing ingredients; drizzle over the top. Cool completely. Cut into bars. Yield: 3-4 dozen.




